**ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY TO ACCEPT THE DEDICATION OF A DRAINAGE EASEMENT FROM LOUIS CRITELLI AS FURTHER DESCRIBED HEREIN AND PURSUANT TO THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE**

**WHEREAS**, the Township of West Milford has storm drain outlet pipes located on a portion of property designated as Block 6002, Lot 3 and otherwise identified as 542 Morsetown Road which requires a drainage easement from the owner of said property; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Engineer advises that a twenty-five (25) foot wide easement is necessary for proper drainage and free flow of storm water over the aforesaid property; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Council of the Township of West Milford is desirous of obtaining said drainage easement; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Attorney has prepared a Deed of Easement granting the Township of West Milford the right to access and encroach upon said easement with the owner bearing the responsibility to maintain said easement in good, clean and structurally sound manner; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of West Milford does hereby determine to accept said dedication of the within drainage easement as set forth herein for the benefit of the Township of West Milford and the public in general.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The drainage easement set forth in the easement of dedication, on file with the Township Clerk, being part of Block 6002 Lot 3, is hereby accepted as and for a public drainage easement.
2. The Township Attorney is authorized and directed to accept the Drainage Easement and to record same for the benefit of the Township.
3. If any article, section, subsection, term or condition of this Ordinance is declared invalid or illegal for any reason, the balance of the Ordinance shall be deemed severable and shall remain in full force and effect.
4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions that are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent necessary.
5. This Ordinance shall take effect after publication and passage according to law.

**ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY TO AUTHORIZE THE EXECUTION OF THE PERMANENT EASEMENT FROM THE GREENBROOK PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION AS FURTHER DESCRIBED HEREIN AND PURSUANT TO THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE**

**WHEREAS**, Greenbrook Property Owners Association is the owner of certain property in the Township known as Block 6704, Lot 9, West Milford, New Jersey, ("Greenbrook's property"); and

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**WHEREAS**, the Township is currently about to undertake an extensive project to construct, reconstruct, and maintain certain stormwater improvements with some of those improvements taking place on a portion of Block 6704, Lot 9; and

**WHEREAS**, with the construction and maintenance taking place on a portion of Greenbrook's property it is necessary that the Township receive permanent authorization from the property owner to access that portion of property in order to conduct such required activities; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Council of the Township of West Milford is desirous of obtaining said easement; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Attorney has prepared a Deed of Easement granting the Township of West Milford the permanent right to access and encroach upon said easement in order to properly maintain the stormwater improvements; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of West Milford does hereby determine to accept said dedication of the within easement as set forth herein for the benefit of the Township of West Milford and the public in general.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic and State of New Jersey as follows:

1. The permanent easement set forth in the easement of dedication, on file with the Township Clerk, being part of Block 6704 Lot 9, is hereby accepted.
2. The Township Attorney is authorized and directed to accept the Easement and to record same for the benefit of the Township.
3. If any article, section, subsection, term or condition of this Ordinance is declared invalid or illegal for any reason, the balance of the Ordinance shall be deemed severable and shall remain in full force and effect.
4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances or resolutions that are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are repealed to the extent necessary.
5. This Ordinance shall take effect after publication and passage according to law.

**Public Comments**

Mayor Bieri opened the meeting to the public after advising that there is a five-minute limit for each speaker.

Ed Rosone, 192 Vreeland Road, West Milford stated that there have been numerous articles about drug problems in the state. We need a drug resistance program in our school in addition to SROs. A solid school program will help combat this problem. He has been approached by many residents seeking resources to address this problem and he has compiled a list of resources.

Jim Novack, Larchmont Drive, West Milford wants more details about two discussion items on the agenda. Item #14 on the agenda does not have an address; just a block & lot. Item #13 addresses tax concessions for the owner of the old Kemp property. We should not waive taxes on a property with whom we have an agreement part of which is a requirement that he bring his taxes up to date.

Luke Slott, 10 Ponderosa Place, West Milford stated that the pavilion on Nosenzo Pond Road needs improvement. He participated in the beautification and cleanup day where a lot of effort was needed at the CYO field because there was a lot of trash at that facility. Despite the beautiful surroundings of the pavilion

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there is a lot of trash in the area. Kids tend to hang out at this pavilion and he is hoping that if the Township focuses on this matter these activities will stop. He asked for increased patrols of this area. The acquisition of this property is great for West Milford. It should be better taken care of.

Doris Aaronson, 19 Bearfort Road, West Milford stated that she is speaking on behalf of Pinecliff Lake as a trustee. She has spoken with staff at DPW on a few occasions and some times through Administrator Boyle about repairing the storm drain on Pinecliff Drive. The trustees would like the cone removed before winter sets in. Residents near Pinecliff Lake Drive and Arcadia have complained about a barricade that has been there for five years. Would like that storm drain repaired too before winter sets in. She stated that there are ALF signs throughout the Township; one was on Mr. Castronova's property with "sidewalk" written on the opposite side. Someone is stapling signs over Pinecliff Lake signs saying and using them to promote the installation of sidewalks.

Wayne Gottlieb, 20 South Richfield Road West Milford advised he is speaking as a private citizen, not as a member of the Board of Education. There is a memorandum from the West Milford Environmental Commission to the Board of Education and the Township Council from August 15<sup>th</sup> regarding runoff from artificial turf fields. The memo takes a verbatim transcript from a DEP document but excludes certain information contained in that DEP document thereby taking the content of the DEP document out of context. Taken out of context in this manner, the information is disingenuous. He received information via mail and at his home by certified mail about filings made in superior court. The documents were not signed by a judge but by an individual and were sent in a manner that would imply that they were official court documents. As a member of the public, he now has no confidence in the Environmental Commission because of the information disseminated in the manner in which it was done. These people should go. It would seem that the spouse of one of the authors may be planning to run for the Board of Education next year and may have a personal agenda in this matter. He stated that he will be in attendance at the consistency review at the Planning Board for the turf field.

Robert Nicholson, Hyde Road, Stockholm thanked the Mayor & Council for establishing the Economic Development Committee (EDC). The EDC is seeking to accomplish a number of things. He distributed a report as to what they are doing and advised that Deborah Hoffman from the Passaic County EDC attended the last meeting. She offered advise about county programs that are available to local merchants. It is important to establish local economic development. They are working with the chamber and are seeking to improve that cooperation which is very important. They discussed illegal commercial enterprises which have a negative impact on those engaging in honest business practices and he stated that the EDC would like assistance in enforcing these laws. The Chamber is planning a meet-n-greet early in 2011 and he will provide updates and invites when appropriate. We should try to help our local businesses in as many ways as possible and to that end he proposed that the Township air a video on the local channel when we resolve the cable contract. There are some eyesores in Town and he asked if the areas surrounding signs welcoming people to West Milford can be beautified.

Nancy Hunt stated that she is here on behalf of Chamber of Commerce. The Chamber supports the EDC and appreciates the opportunity to work with them. They would like to see more sidewalks in town to promote pedestrian traffic. She agreed with Mr. Nicholson that there are many unlicensed contractors working in town. These businesses undermine the local businesses who are operating under the law. She would like to see an initiative to educate homeowners about the problems that can occur when homeowners hire contractors who are not licensed. She urged residents to contact the Better Business Bureau to determine if a contractor or business is registered with the State. Properly registered contractors are licensed and insured. She thanked Bob Nicholson for doing positive things for West Milford.

Lou Signorino, 3 Redbarn Lane, West Milford would like to see school busing issues in the Township addressed. Urged the Council to look into addressing the issues of busing that affect the safety of our kids.

There being no more comments from the public Councilman Nolan moved to close the public portion of the meeting.

**Council Comments**

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Township Attorney Semrau stated that Fred, it is the council's discretion as to how they wish to handle the tax issue at Kemp. Gave the address for item #14 on the agenda.

Councilman Weisbecker thanked Master Slott for the photos provided. He asked Mr. Semrau and Mr. Boyle about the liability associated with people cleaning up Township property. Mr. Semrau advised that if such efforts are part of a Township sponsored event like Beautification Day people are covered. Councilman Weisbecker asked Administrator Boyle to inform Chief Chiosie of information provided by Luke about activities at CYO. He asked Mr. Semrau what can be done about issues raised by Mr. Gottlieb. Mr. Semrau stated that has spoken with the Planning Board Engineer about concerns outlined in the Environmental Commission memorandum. The Engineer has advised him that the issues broached about zinc have been resolved to everyone's satisfaction. Councilman Weisbecker noted that Mr. Gottlieb implied there is malice in the Environmental Commission memo by excluding the subsequent DEP paragraph to which Mr. Semrau replied that it would have been helpful if the Environmental Commission had included the second paragraph. Nonetheless, the issue about zinc was addressed. Councilman Weisbecker commended Economic Development Commission and the work they are doing. He asked Administrator Boyle who maintains sidewalks abutting Township property. Mr. Boyle stated that maintenance including snow removal is the responsibility of the owner, be it Township, County or private.

Councilman Nolan thanked the High School green team and Master Slott for working on the Beautification Day cleanup. He has worked on three clean up efforts this year and has learned that most roadside garbage is cans and bottles. If the State of New Jersey were to pass a law that allowed can deposits such legislation may very well result in reduced garbage. He stated that contractors who provide services to local residents are supposed to either obtain a building permit or have the homeowner do so. Without that, the Township would find it difficult to enforce laws pertaining to using licensed contractors. Councilman Jurkovic stated that there is added difficulty because people can get permits in their own name and have someone else do the work. Councilwoman Lichtenberg stated that this is another reason for the Council to enact a certificate of occupancy requirement after the revaluation for home sales.

Councilman Jurkovic addressed Mr. Semrau about the issues raised by Mr. Gottlieb. In effect, Mr. Gottlieb is saying that a member of the Environmental Commission is writing a memo while her spouse was seeking to partake in litigation against the Township. It may be helpful if the Township attorney were to remind committee, commission and board members about recusal parameters. He suggested that Councilman Ramaglia work with Chamber of Commerce on educational initiatives that will help to achieve the goals of the Economic Development Committee (EDC). If minimal funding is needed, perhaps he could approach the Council on that. The EDC memo references a wish list comprised of three items and he asked that the Council look into these suggestions which include a boat launch, a campground and a website. Mr. Boyle stated that he and his staff are looking into using Westbrook as a campground. Mayor Bieri stated that she had discussed that with staff some time ago based on requests from a segment of our youth population. Councilwoman Lichtenberg asked if the Township can address the boat launch in the proposed lease at Brown's Point. Mr. Boyle expressed concern that there may be conflicts with the boat fee ordinance recently enacted.

Council President Smolinski advised that there were complaints about storm drains at the Senior Advisory Committee. At Cahill Cross Road, Lake Lookover, and on Camelot Drive there are sunken storm drains. Administrator Boyle stated that he will look into these concerns.

**Discussion Items**

1)	Memo of Understanding – Greenwood Lake Drawdown – Mr. Boyle advised that in early August the Greenwood Lake Commission took a vote to forego drawdown this year and are seeking to postpone it to 2011/2012. Many of the Council's issues have been resolved. Councilwoman Lichtenberg expressed concern that in the last paragraph it says that West Milford will support any and all efforts of Greenwood Lake. Mr. Semrau stated that he shares those and he recommended that the Township draft an own agreement which addresses these issues and the issue of access to Storms Island. Councilman Nolan agreed. The Council gave consensus to have Mr. Semrau draft a resolution for November workshop discussion.
2)	Contracts – Turf Field at McCormack Field – Mr. Boyle advised that \$25,000 has already been drawn from the escrow funds. However, the work has been stalled and he has received a request from DT Allen to draw down additional funds to avoid storage costs. He stated that we do not have a construction and payment schedule so therefore, he is asking to release limited funds (275,000) now with the rest to be released when we have the construction schedule. Mr. Semrau stated that the contract asked that money be set aside as a performance guarantee. It did not require release of funds based on a schedule. Generally, an engineer signs off on each phase before funds are released. We released the \$25,000 to

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	<p>fund the deposit to order the materials and as such he would defer to Council and Administrator. From a legal standpoint he recommends that the Township not release any more monies until work starts. Council could consider some kind of progress payments. Councilman Jurkovic agreed adding that the Council cannot support release of funds unless it is in furtherance of construction because that would defeat the purpose of the escrow account. Councilman Nolan asked who authorized the release of the \$25,000. Mr. Semrau said that he takes responsibility for that because they wanted to go on site at that point of time and it predated the delays. This request, he said, is of greater significance. Councilman Nolan took issue stating that this should be a Council decision and the intent is not to finance DT Allen. When the field is built in accordance with the specifications they get the money from escrow. Council President Smolinski advised that the established start date was September 1<sup>st</sup>. Then spikes were put in the heart of this project. He questioned how we can restore good faith in the process without making a payment. He is not promoting the release of \$275,000. However, he does believe that we should work to restore good faith to the process. Mr. Semrau stated that the escrow represents a guarantee and when the work begins he can request release of funds during various phases of the project. We could ask DT Allen's engineer and our engineer to prepare a construction schedule which could be linked to release of funds. Then Council can review that and make decisions accordingly. Both of the Allen brothers gave personal guarantees to complete this work in addition to the guarantees provided by DTAK, their corporation. Council President Smolinski stated that they displayed good faith but certain West Milford residents caused this discord. He trusts Mr. Semrau and Mr. Ferriero to work out a plan that will benefit everyone. Councilman Nolan stated that he favors paying DT Allen when the work is done adding that the Township does not have the money yet from Passaic County Open Space funds. Their request for additional charges for storage is not the Township's problem. Councilman Jurkovic stated that they are asking for the money with no explanation and no work in progress. The escrow was requested in the contract for a reason. He understands Council President Smolinski's perspective and asked the Administration to seek an explanation for the release these funds. Mr. Semrau asked if the Governing Body wants to consider a plan for drawdown based on various construction levels. Councilman Nolan recalled that the project was supposed to take six weeks from start to finish. Councilman Weisbecker asked was this delay caused the Township. Councilman Jurkovic stated that part of the process should require an explanation as to why they need the funds. Mr. Semrau asked the Council to ratify the \$25,000 that has been paid already. Councilman Jurkovic made the motion, Councilman Weisbecker seconded and by unanimous roll call the Council ratified the payment of \$25,000 made to DT Allen to date. Councilman Jurkovic recognized that there has been a delay and he asked if someone can determine if the party or parties responsible for the delays can be held accountable for costs incurred as a result of the delay. Mr. Semrau stated that he did send a letter to Mr. Foody putting him on notice that he may be held liable. We could gather those costs and discuss how to proceed. The council gave consensus to have Mr. Semrau determine extent of costs. Mayor Bieri stated that storage costs are estimated at \$9,000 and there is a proposed reinstatement cost of \$4,500. Mr. Boyle stated that everyone is waiting for the Planning Board meeting tomorrow night before reactivating the job. Mayor Bieri stated that typically government works too slowly but in this case, we may have worked too fast to realize an exciting project that will benefit so many. There has been a huge and disappointing impact on our students. The concerns raised have been addressed and now there are extra costs just because of contractual needs. In our effort to do the right thing we ultimately did a disservice. Council President Smolinski stated that it was neither the board nor the Council who stopped this project. Certain vocal minorities speaking against that which is supported by so many caused these delays and costs. They threatened litigation and the BOE took appropriate measures. If we started September 1<sup>st</sup> as planned, the kids would be playing on the new turf field this weekend. He never heard our professionals recommending that we delay this job. He does not question the counsel of our attorney. We must all stick together to see this project to completion. Mayor Bieri agreed adding that all members of the governing body and the BOE but one favored this project and continues to favor it. Councilman Jurkovic agreed that both boards by majority supported this. It is particularly offensive that one single member of one of the bodies took action to undermine and delay the installation of this field. It is okay to disagree and the Council has often had to respect decisions of fellow members and their votes. The public will is to be done by the majority view of the bodies. For one member to take this to court is particularly offensive.</p>
3)	<p>Contract Agreement between Township and BOE for use of Fields – Mr. Boyle stated that he has a draft of the agreement for use of the new turf field as well as the lapsed BOE field agreement. There are two memos attached to the paperwork. He provided an overview of the meetings that have taken place to date and he sought Council direction based on the memos from the Director of Community Services &amp; Recreation. If there are additional comments he will ask Mr. Semrau to incorporate them into a final document for submittal to the BOE. Councilwoman Lichtenberg made some recommendations for minor additions and changes and she asked if we need an agreement to address the times the BOE uses municipal fields</p>

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	and facilities. Mayor suggested that the agreement not expire unless and/or until there is no longer a turf field at this site. Councilman Nolan asked if there will be security cameras at this site.
4)	Contract – Wallisch Estates Easement – Tennessee Gas Pipeline – Mr. Boyle reviewed the due diligence done by the attorney and tax assessor and advised that TGP has provided information pertaining to all Federal permitting. He met with individuals from TGP this afternoon. The proposed easement is a 55’ easement. At his time, they are seeking to have a temporary and permanent easement and he reviewed the parameters of both. The temporary easement would require replacement of felled trees. The permanent easements would not. The wetlands issues are being reviewed by DEP. TGP is hoping for spring construction with tree removal beginning this winter and they wish to move forward as they are tight on time. The tree removal is a six week process. The Environmental Commission continues to review environmental issues and Councilman Nolan raised issues about safety. TGP is confident that they can address the safety concerns and avoid an incident like that that which occurred in California. They conduct regular inspections for safety reasons and such processes are required by the Federal government. The DEP will have inspectors onsite throughout the process and the Division of Soil Conservation will be heavily involved. The Council gave consensus to proceed and asked Mr. Boyle to seek a recommendation from the Environmental Commission and perhaps have TGP make a presentation to them. Council President Smolinski questioned how a gas company gets approvals to engage in an environmentally sensitive project while the Township cannot even get approval for a ballfield. We don’t even get a realistic financial benefit. Mayor Bieri agreed. She stated that the Tax Assessor has issued a memo stating that \$12,000 for this easement is a fair value despite the fact that this is a for profit business who is reaping significant benefit from this project and, in her estimation, it is worth more than \$12,000. Councilman Jurkovic asked to have our engineers look at this project to determine if it would have any impact on our potential use of this property in the future.
5)	Contract – Brown’s Point Lease – Mr. Boyle asked the Council if they wish to consider any amendments to the proposed lease agreement adding that he will review the potential for a boat launch as discussed earlier. Council President Smolinski stated that he is happy to see that a boat launch is not included for a number of reasons. There is no parking at that facility for trailers and he does not like the concept of the municipality competing with marinas. However, kayaks and canoes can easily use this facility. Mr.Boyle stated that he will address those uses in the new agreement. Councilman Jurkovic asked Mr. Boyle to speak with Chief Costello because he recalled that the Township cut funding for training for water rescue because during the budget process there did not appear to be a potential need at that time. Mr. Semrau requested that the Administrator provide the Risk Manager with a copy of the insurance policy for review.
6)	Contract – Cable Franchise Renewal – Mr. Boyle stated that he received a call from Gary Shaw of Cablevision who advised that they will increase economic remuneration from \$3,000 on a ten year term to \$6,000 on a fifteen year term. Will get that in writing shortly to finalize the contract. These proposed changes will mean that a ten-year contract would result in \$45,000 and a fifteen-year contract would be \$90,000 over the term of contract. Councilman Jurkovic stated that as a result we would no longer use their people to film the meetings. The Township would get a dedicated channel and control programming. This is a community service they provide to our community and the money they are providing will fund the equipment and setup allowing us to broadcast our meetings. The current methods are not working. With the proposed changes, we could broadcast school activities, football games, other Township events. It is an exciting opportunity that we should weigh against something we agree does not work at all. Mayor Bieri asked who will operate this system. Councilman Weisbecker asked to take this to the Lakes Committee for review and comment. The Council gave consensus to have him do that.
