Minutes of: Governing Body Regular Meeting
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Councilman Signorino asked what the total surplus was last year, and if they could take \$300,000 from cash on hand. We are using this spreadsheet to base our decision about taking \$300,000 from surplus to get to a 0% increase. It's been done before in the past. Mayor Bieri said if they take \$300,000 from cash on hand it's not the fiscally right thing to do in the long term. She doesn't want to diminish savings or surplus. She suggested introducing the budget with a potential increase. In long term planning what you take today will have an impact in future years. Councilman Wagner said since they are introducing the budget today, he would like the roads to remain in the capital budget. Take \$300,000 from surplus; they could always put it back, but introduce it now as 0% tax increase. Councilman Hensley said he is not looking to use the \$2,500,000 that they are using in this year's budget in next year's budget. They would have to make up the difference somewhere which could mean a dramatic tax increase next year. He suggested putting a plan in place to consider introducing the roads into the operating budget over the course of the next three years. Councilwoman Erik mentioned at the end of last year, the County voted to put \$30,000,000 to Passaic County Tech. She said they would have to pay that back.

Mayor Bieri said they should introduce a budget at the next meeting, and she asked for a consensus poll for the three outstanding issues. The Council gave consensus for the following; \$60,000 (fire) move to operating, keep \$1,000,000 for road resurfacing in the capital budget, and introduce a surplus of \$2.8 million.

Public Comments

Mayor Bieri opened the meeting to the public after advising that there is a five-minute limit for each speaker.

Michael Yazgi, Cedar Grove, NJ & Chris Wan, Parsippany, NJ – Mr. Yazgi said he is in the transfer process of purchasing a liquor license in town and they want to open a restaurant/bar at 99 Marshall Hill Road. They are requesting approval from the Governing Body to have the liquor license cited at 99 Marshall Hill Road because Wine and Spirits is within 2,500 feet. Mr. Yazgi said there is town code that states the type of business he wants to open has to be within a certain amount of feet from Wine and Spirits.

Mayor Bieri asked the Governing Body if they would like to open a discussion now instead of moving forward with the public comments. The Governing Body gave consent.

Discussion:

Councilwoman Erik asked Mr. Yazgi the distance between 99 Marshall Hill Road and Wine and Spirits. Mr. Yazgi said the distance is 1,800. Councilwoman Erik suggested the Governing Body look into the amount of liquor licenses in this town that are active and inactive and how many the town is required by the state to have.

Mayor Bieri asked Mr. Yazgi if he was asking for an exemption to the Ordinance and he said yes. She asked if the Governing Body would have the right to make the exemption of the ordinance if that was the Governing Body's decision. They could find out the restrictions from the State regarding churches and schools making sure they were not violating a state regulation.

Administrator Battaglia said the process would be through a Resolution of the Governing Body, and the Governing Body could direct an amendment to the ordinance. If the Governing Body wants to change the code, it would require an amendment.

Councilman Wagner said amending the ordinance would be the best process.

Mr. Semrau said the Governing Body should have some type of standard reason for amending the ordinance otherwise the ordinance is discretionary and arbitrary. Ask the staff if there is a reason for exceptional circumstances. There are different parts of the community that the ordinance could apply to. It doesn't have to apply to the entire township. It could fall under the zoning laws.

Councilman Signorino said he supports the idea but suggested the Governing Body takes the proper steps and does not rush into amending an ordinance. He would like to know what the perimeters are and the concerns the Governing Body should be addressing.

Mayor Bieri said the Governing Body should get a professional opinion on the basis for an exemption and then look long term for revising the ordinance.

Mr. Nicholson 20 Hyde Road - said the DPW did a great job with the snow plowing. A lot of these ordinances were done before the Highlands Act. The Highlands Act put a lot of restrictions on the town. If there is something that could add beauty to the town it would be beneficial. If there is something that the people want, let the people decide and not an ordinance. Don't put limitations on businesses if the business is beneficial for the town.

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Mr. Steele North Glenwood Road- said the town ordinances should be consistent with the state laws. He said he would put together a draft stating the inconsistencies between the town codes and state rules regarding governing commissions. He asked the Governing Body to think about whether a future Mayor of West Milford should be in the position to be the only one who makes all the appointments when there is a tie vote.

There being no further comments from the public, Mayor Bieri made a motion to close the public portion of the meeting.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING CHANGE ORDERS NOS. 6-11 – FINAL TO UNIMAK LLC FOR THE NEW LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION PROJECT FOR AN OVERALL INCREASE OF \$27,631.65

WHEREAS the Board of Trustees of the West Milford Township Library and the Governing Body of the Township of West Milford have entered into a partnership to build a new \$4,845,000 library facility, and

WHEREAS the Mayor and Council of the Township of West Milford authorized the award of a construction contract for the New Library Construction Project to UniMak, LLC by Resolution 2015-287, and

WHEREAS proper shielding and housing of computer network wiring supporting the Township meeting spaces and the Library's Children's Room requires the installation of EMT conduit between the first and second floor concrete block, and

WHEREAS pursuant to the Change Order Nos. 6-11 – FINAL report prepared by the Library Director, the amount of increase for the project to install said conduit as Change Order No. 6 is \$1,151.71, or 0.02377%, and

WHEREAS the installation of a skylight on the roof of the fire pump house will negate the need to dismantle the roof when the pump requires repair or replacement beyond standard maintenance, and

WHEREAS pursuant to the Change Order Nos. 6-11 – FINAL report prepared by the Library Director, the amount of increase for the project to install said skylight as Change Order No. 7 is \$1,819.23, or 0.03755%, and

WHEREAS the electrical wiring for a second floor sprinkler compressor pump was not accounted for in the project specifications, and

WHEREAS pursuant to the Change Order Nos. 6-11 – FINAL report prepared by the Library Director, the amount of increase for the project to install said wiring as Change Order No. 8 is \$972.16, or 0.02007%, and

WHEREAS modifications to the storm system as drawn are needed to properly accommodate drainage needs from the roof and away from the building, and

WHEREAS pursuant to the Change Order Nos. 6-11 – FINAL report prepared by the Library Director, the amount of increase for the project to modify the storm system as Change Order No. 9 is \$6,201.02, or 0.12799%, and

WHEREAS modifications to the water line route, required to allow construction to continue while regulatory requirements were satisfied and a well was successfully drilled, added, among other complexities, 90 feet to the line, pipe crossings, and asphalt saw cutting not included in the original plans, and

WHEREAS pursuant to the Change Order Nos. 6-11 – FINAL report prepared by the Library Director, the amount of increase for the project to modify the water line in said manner as Change Order No. 10 is \$12,402.50, or 0.25599%, and

WHEREAS the installation of additional snow clips on the roof is recommended to prevent ice and snow falling off the roof in sheets under certain weather conditions, potentially damaging the building and creating a hazard, and

WHEREAS pursuant to the Change Order Nos. 6-11 – FINAL report prepared by the Library Director, the amount of increase for the project to install said snow clips as Change Order No. 11 is \$5,085.03, or 0.10495%, and

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WHEREAS the aforementioned changes to the contract, and previously approved Change Orders No. 1 – 5, is equal to \$74,471.32, which results in an adjusted contract amount of \$4,919,471.32 that represents a 1.53708% increase, and

WHEREAS the Chief Financial Officer has certified to the availability of funds for these change orders, said funds to be paid from the remaining balance of the grant appropriation previously approved for this project in account number 04-215-55-824-001,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic and State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The Township Administrator is hereby authorized to exceed the original contract award of \$4,845,000.00 to UniMak LLC, by an amount not to exceed \$74,471.32 (1.53708%).

WHEREAS, the 2016 suspension of the Transportation Trust Fund delayed implementation of Municipal Aid projects; and

WHEREAS, West Milford Township has initiated the 2017 capital appropriation process to restore the local contribution; and

WHEREAS, West Milford Township has demonstrated a robust commitment to the Municipal Aid Program by contributing \$3,227,000 to supplement \$3,100,000 of State Aide grants over the last 10 years; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic and State of New Jersey that the New Jersey Department of Transportation is hereby requested to extend the deadline for award of contract for Ridge Road – Section 3, Contract 4 from April 10, 2017 to October 10, 2017.

Discussion:

Councilman Hensley said the Gypsy Moths are a natural course of nature and the spraying is a health concern. Mayor Bieri said she received an email from a concerned resident last year who was in the spray zones. The resident said before the spraying they heard the frogs and crickets, and after the spraying they no longer heard them. Councilman Signorino said he agrees with Councilman Hensley. The spraying would be in the air and reach our water supply. Councilman Wagner said it's devastating what the Gypsy Moths have done to the trees and properties. Councilwoman Erik said the spraying is a natural bacterium. The treatment used by homeowners is worse and it could be harmful. Mayor Bieri said she would welcome additional feedback from residents and it would be helpful. She would like to do more research; so she will abstain until the Governing Body gets more information.
