The Ceremony is to recognize and celebrate the winners of the “My County Poster Calendar” Contest. These contests are open to all 4th graders because the majority of 4th graders study New Jersey state history as part of their social studies curriculum. The goal of the program is to create a poster that reflects all that is special and unique about Passaic County. The history, places of local interest, recreational opportunities, as well as our ethnic and cultural diversity.

In celebration of the 100th anniversary of the passage of the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution which granted women the right to vote, Clerk Ireland-Imhof expanded this year’s Poster Contest giving 4th graders the option submit a poster based on the theme of women’s suffrage. Many fantastic entries were submitted depicting this second theme. A panel of female guest judges, including Passaic County Community College’s Art Professor Mary Dajnak, had the difficult task of selecting this category’s top winners. “I was quite impressed to see so many students submit a poster regarding women’s suffrage. It’s great to know that even 100 years later, the up and coming generation has a genuine appreciation for the difficult work accomplished by the suffragists long before us” said Clerk Ireland-Imhof.
