RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY RECOMMENDING CHANGES IN THE SEPTIC INSPECTION PROCESS

WHEREAS, the Township of West Milford has entered into a shared services agreement with the County of Passaic for all health related services, including septic system inspections; and

WHEREAS, the Township and County agree that changes to the existing septic system inspection process should be made to improve efficiency and effectiveness; and

WHEREAS, the Township Administrator and Township/County Health Officer have agreed upon the changes that should be made and recommend to the Township Council that they should be implemented.

WHEREAS, the recommended septic inspection process is outlined below.

Inspections by Passaic County Department of Health Services

- Soil Logs In-person inspection required
- Open Bed In-person inspection required
- Final Grade As needed

Inspections by the Septic System Design Engineer

- Suitable Fill
- Pipe and Stone stone source and size certified by design engineer

Key Requirements for Contractors

· Contractors must call in for each phase of the installation process to schedule inspections

Additional Septic System Inspection Requirements and Documentation

- Spot inspections may be performed on a case-by-case basis at the discretion of the Registered Environmental Health Specialist
- Design engineer is required to submit photographs documenting the suitable fill and pipe/stone inspection phases via email to health@westmilford.org
- Design engineers must provide written certification confirming that each inspection phase was completed in accordance with NJAC 7.9a requirements, which shall be included in the final as-built or submitted as a separate signed and sealed letter

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Township Council concur with the recommendation of the Township Administrator and Township/County Health Officer that the above septic system inspection process would improve efficiency and effectiveness.

BE IT FURTHER REOLVED that these changes shall be implemented as soon as practical but no later than March 3, 2025.
