#### **Public Comments**

Richard Randazzo – 278 Wooley Road, has watched the Council for years and has witnessed some bad behavior. This Council is much better, but he feels that they buckled under the Federal Government regarding the Tennessee Gas Pipeline compressor station. He feels like the Council is not always listening and that they asked for facts and facts were presented concerning the gas pipeline. This Council did not pass the noise ordinance, but rather let the state do it. The state guidelines are just guidelines, and the Council could have done what it wanted for the town. Mr. Randazzo mentioned the well ordinance and questioned the Council's qualifications for making certain decisions rather than making a recommendation and then handing the ordinances off to the Planning Board or the Zoning Board for the professionals to handle. There are no qualifications to be on the Council and while the job is getting done he is disappointed with the Council because he feels they have lost focus. Mr. Randazzo questioned the cannabis ordinance, the licensing fees and the Council's ability to write the ordinances. In the past, as with the well ordinance, professionals had been brought in and research had been done.

Robert Nicholson - Stockholm, requested that when the representatives from the County Board of Health speak at the meetings, they introduce themselves for the purpose of the viewing audience.

Seeing no one else wanted to speak, Councilwoman Erik moved to close the public portion. Seconded by Councilwoman Lichtenberg. All were in favor.

### **Council Comments**

Councilwoman Erik – Stated that she does research and reads a lot, and also looks at what is being done in other towns. Regarding the noise ordinance, we had the noise ordinance that the state had and then they changed it and we no longer had an ordinance. The bottom line is that you can make the ordinance tougher than what the state law is but you cannot make it less tough.

Councilman Chazukow – Addressed Mr. Randazzo and his noise ordinance comments by telling him that a lot of times ordinances do not come to fruition in the way one would want or expect, whether it is a noise ordinance, a bulk standards ordinance or an ordinance for cutting down trees. Councilman Chazukow was insistent that the Council did listen to the people complaining about the gas compressor and they disagreed with them and that is not the same as not listening.

Councilman Goodsir – Indicated that it was not that the Council was not listening to the public, but rather had heard the same thing week after week and that a lot of what was being presented by the public was not factual.

Mayor Dale – Stated that the ordinances are written by the Attorney and that research is done. Then they are presented for a first reading and there is discussion and then the ordinances go to the Planning Board and their role is to review the ordinances and decide if they conform to the master plan of the township. The Planning Board doesn't get to chop it up and tell the Council how they think it should read. Perhaps that aspect makes things a little confusing. Suggestions are welcome but the Planning Board does not dictate to the Council or vice versa. Also, the state comes into play with deadlines and had the governing body had more time for instance with the cannabis ordinance, they could have taken more time and done a better job.

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30, the dwelling house and the lot whereupon the same is erected, of any citizen and resident of this State, honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances, from active service, in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States, who has been or shall be declared by the United States Veterans Administration or its successor to have a service-connected disability declared by the United States Veterans Administration or its successor to be a total or 100% Totally and Permanently Disabled, and not so evaluated solely because of hospitalization or surgery and recuperation, sustained through enemy action, or accident, or resulting from disease contracted while in such active service, shall be exempt from taxation on proper claim made therefor; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.31, upon review and approval of the required documentation by the municipal tax assessor, the assessor shall allow said exemption from taxation for the tax year in which the claim was filed; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32, the Governing Body of each municipality, by appropriate resolution, may return all taxes collected on property from prior years which would have been exempt had proper claim been timely made in writing; and

**WHEREAS**, the statutory intent to grant discretion to the Governing Body of every municipality has been affirmed by court decisions that have held that a municipality has discretion to grant or deny a taxpayer a retroactive refund of property taxes that has been paid from the effective date of the disability as determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs as set forth in N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Council desires to establish a formal policy providing that a retroactive refund of property taxes as set forth in N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32 shall be limited to the current year of the submission of a proper claim to the tax assessor as required by N.J.S.A. 54:4-30.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1**. Article II, General Legislation, of the Code of the Township of West Milford is hereby amended and supplemented to establish Chapter 349, entitled "100% Disabled Veteran Tax Refunds," which shall read in its entirety as follows:

#### Chapter 349, 100% Disabled Veteran Tax Refunds

A refund of property taxes pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32 shall be granted provided that the applicant submits a complete application to the tax assessor as required by N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30, and shall also be applicable as to surviving spouses of Civil Unions or Domestic Partnerships. A retroactive refund of property taxes as set forth in N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32 shall be limited to the date of the submission of a proper claim to the Tax Assessor, as required.

- **SECTION 2.** All Ordinances of the Township of West Milford that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **SECTION 3.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- **SECTION 4**. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days following final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

**WHEREAS**, the ongoing opioid crisis in America has had a devastating effect on individuals and communities, including many here in the Township of West Milford; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township of West Milford is a party to a class action lawsuit filed by state, local, and tribal governments, hospitals, individuals, and insurers, seeking damages against opioid manufacturers, distributors, and retailers in In re National Prescription Opiate Litigation, Case No. 17-md-02804, MDL No. 2804, in the District Court for the Northern District of Ohio; and

**WHEREAS**, on August 20, 2021, Acting Attorney General Andrew J. Bruck announced that New Jersey intends to join nationwide settlement agreements with New Jersey based pharmaceutical company Johnson & Johnson and the United States' three largest pharmaceutical distributors, McKesson, Cardinal Health and AmerisourceBergen, to resolve claims involving their roles in fomenting the country's opioid crisis; and

**WHEREAS**, participation in the nationwide settlements will not only hold the companies financially accountable by requiring payments of as much as \$26 billion, the settlements will provide funding to support programs that address the opioid epidemic in New Jersey and across the country, and will require significant changes in the pharmaceutical industry aimed at preventing similar crises in the future; and

WHEREAS, the proposed settlements provide: "the Distributors to pay up to \$21 billion over 18 years and Janssen to pay up to \$5 billion over no more than 9 years, for a total of \$26 billion (the "Settlement Amount"). Of the Settlement Amount, approximately \$22.7 billion is earmarked for use by participating states and subdivisions to remediate and abate the impacts of the opioid crisis. The Settlements also contain injunctive relief provisions governing the opioid marketing, sale and distribution practices at the heart of the states' and subdivisions' lawsuits and further require the Distributors to implement additional safeguards to prevent diversion of prescription opioids;" and

**WHEREAS**, participation by a significant number of states, county, and municipal governments nationwide must agree to the proposed terms in order for the settlements to take effect; and

**WHEREAS**, provided enough states opt to participate in the settlements, their subdivisions had until January 2, 2022 to join; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township's share in the settlement funds will ultimately depend on the number of counties and municipalities that opt-in, population of each participating county and municipality, and effects of the opioid epidemic on each participating community; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interests of the Township and its residents to participate and join in the settlement agreements in order to hold these companies financially accountable for the ongoing opioid crisis and to implement the necessary changes to prevent such a crisis from happening again in the near future.

**WHEREAS**, the Township Administrator acted in accordance with the recommendation of the Township Attorney to ensure that the Township opted into the settlement prior to the deadline; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the Township of West Milford authorizes the Township to join the settlement agreements with Johnson & Johnson, McKesson, Cardinal Health and AmerisourceBergen to resolve claims involving their participation in the opioid crisis.

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of West Milford does hereby determine that the lands and properties set forth in Schedule A are no longer needed for public use; and

This deposit shall be non-refundable. The balance of the purchase price shall be paid to the Township no later than sixty (60) days following the acceptance by the Township and the tender of marketable title to the purchaser and submitted to the Township. The purchaser shall be entitled to possession immediately following closing of title.
- 6. The Township makes no representation as to the title or any other aspects of the land to be sold.
- 7. At closing of title, purchaser shall also pay to the Township a buyer's premium in the amount of ten (10%) percent of the bid amount.
- 8. The Township reserves the right to accept or reject any and all bids at the public sale and not to award to the highest bidder. Such decision will be made by the Township Council at a Public Meeting within 30 days from the date of such sale. In the event the Township of West Milford is unable to convey clear and marketable title, insurable at regular rates by a title insurance company authorized to do business in the State of New Jersey, the Township shall forthwith return to the purchaser the deposit and neither party shall have any further rights against the other. The acceptance of a deed by the purchaser from the Township shall extinguish any claims the said purchaser may have against the Township of West Milford in connection with the quality of title conveyed.
- 9. All conveyances by the Township shall be made by way of a Quit Claim Deed, unless an adequate title binder prepared at the expense of the purchaser is forwarded to the Township prior to the conveyance and discloses that the Township holds marketable title in which case a Bargain and Sale Deed with Covenants Against Grantor's Acts will be the form of conveyance. The Township will include within its deed a metes and bounds description based upon a survey if a survey and metes and bounds description is obtained by the purchaser.
- 10. The Township Council of the Township of West Milford reserves the right to waive any and all defects and informalities in any proposal and to accept or reject the highest responsible and responsive bidder deemed to be in the best interests of the Township.
- 11. In those cases where the property being offered is an under-sized lot, adjoining property owners shall be given the first right to bid. **WHEREAS**, although property is provided through the 1033 Program at no cost to municipal and county LEAs, these entities are responsible for the costs associated with delivery, maintenance, fueling, and upkeep of the property, and for specialized training on the operation of any acquired property; and

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-30.2 requires that the Governing Body of the municipality or county approve, by a majority of the full membership, both enrollment in, and the acquisition of any property through the 1033 Program.

**WHEREAS**, the Township of West Milford requested proposals for the Marketing of Recyclables which included a methodology to reduce the processing costs to the Township based upon market variation in the value of the recyclables being transported to the vendor; and

**WHEREAS**, two firms responded Recycle City and Atlantic Coast Fibers, LLC, both bidders provided the required bid, administrative information and sufficient information to compare pricing; and

WHEREAS, the Township Administrator has reviewed the bids; and

**WHEREAS**, Atlantic Coast Fibers has agreed to pay the township 85% of the low monthly market price for curbside paper and cardboard collection, including the cardboard and paper container at the recycling center. Price will vary from month to month per market value. Atlantic Coast also will be receiving all curbside commingle at a price of \$85.00 per ton to be paid to the contractor; and

**WHEREAS**, Recycle City has agreed to give us 62% of the market value for our curbside paper and cardboard, with a processing fee of \$20.00 per ton and with an end number of \$20.00 per ton. Recycle City did not bid on the curbside commingle; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township Administrator recommends that the bid of Atlantic Coast Fibers, LLC using the 12-month calculation be accepted with the provision that plastic recycling be limited to plastics identified as # 1, 2, 5 and all paper and cardboard products, excluding pizza boxes.
