1.	Ordinance: Amend Chapter 135 Fees at Bubbling Springs Councilman Chazukow thought the day pass fee seemed like a lot. Mr. Senande indicated that he had spoken to the Recreation Director and the idea behind the fee was to promote memberships. The number of \$15 also makes it easier to make change quickly and keep the line moving. There was discussion about various fees and perhaps a family pass for up to four people for \$25. Councilman Chazukow stated it is a family park and should be treated like one. The suggestion was made to add \$5 for additional people. Mr. Senande will amend it. The volunteer discount remains across the board for any recreation program. The consensus was to move forward.
2.	Ordinance: Amend Chapter 163 Add Food Trucks & Chapter 135 Fees Mr. Senande indicated that this would add an annual fee for a food truck, \$500 per truck. Mayor Dale confirmed the fee goes with the truck not the land. The consensus was to move forward.
3.	Ordinance: Amend Chapter 15-23 Custodian of Records Mr. Senande asked the Council to approve the Police Chief as a deputy custodian of records in the police department to help handle the uptick in OPRA requests for police records now that body cameras are going to be worn. The consensus was to move forward.
4.	Expansion of Neighborhood Commercial Zone on the western side of Upper Greenwood Lake along Warwick Turnpike Mr. Senande indicated this would be an amendment to the Master Plan and the proposal is to have the Planning Board look at this and do a review, asking whether a neighborhood commercial district should be expanded into the lake residential district to cover businesses along Warwick Turnpike. The consensus was to move forward.
5.	Ordinance: Zoning Update as to Cannabis Mr. Senande indicated this was a separate cannabis ordinance. The purpose of this discussion item is to determine if the Council has interest in making cannabis businesses a permitted use rather than a conditional use that way it would bypass the Planning Board and businesses would only have to get zoning approval. The other requirements would remain the same. Councilman Gross indicated that the goal is to streamline things. ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING ARTICLE II GENERAL LEGISLATION, TO CREATE CHAPTER 349 OF THE TOWNSHIP CODE ENTITLED "100% DISABLED VETERAN TAX REFUNDS"

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30, the dwelling house and the lot whereupon the same is erected, of any citizen and resident of this State, honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances, from active service, in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States, who has been or shall be declared by the United States Veterans Administration or its successor to have a service-connected disability declared by the United States Veterans Administration or its successor to be a total or 100% Totally and Permanently Disabled, and not so evaluated solely because of hospitalization or surgery and recuperation, sustained through enemy action, or accident, or resulting from disease contracted while in such active service, shall be exempt from taxation on proper claim made therefor; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.31, upon review and approval of the required documentation by the municipal tax assessor, the assessor shall allow said exemption from taxation for the tax year in which the claim was filed; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32, the Governing Body of each municipality, by appropriate resolution, may return all taxes collected on property from prior years which would have been exempt had proper claim been timely made in writing; and

WHEREAS, the statutory intent to grant discretion to the Governing Body of every municipality has been affirmed by court decisions that have held that a municipality has discretion to grant or deny a taxpayer a retroactive refund of property taxes that has been paid from the effective date of the disability as determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs as set forth in N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32; and

WHEREAS, the Township Council desires to establish a formal policy providing that a retroactive refund of property taxes as set forth in N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32 shall be limited to the current year of the submission of a proper claim to the tax assessor as required by N.J.S.A. 54:4-30.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Article II, General Legislation, of the Code of the Township of West Milford is hereby amended and supplemented to establish Chapter 349, entitled "100% Disabled Veteran Tax Refunds," which shall read in its entirety as follows:

Chapter 349, 100% Disabled Veteran Tax Refunds

A refund of property taxes pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32 shall be granted provided that the applicant submits a complete application to the tax assessor as required by N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30, and shall also be applicable as to surviving spouses of Civil Unions or Domestic Partnerships. A retroactive refund of property taxes as set forth in N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32 shall be limited to the date of the submission of a proper claim to the Tax Assessor, as required.

- **SECTION 2.** All Ordinances of the Township of West Milford that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **SECTION 3.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- **SECTION 4**. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days following final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY CREATING A NEW SECTION 300-10.1, ENTITLED ESCROW REQUIREMENTS FOR TREATMENT WORKS APPROVAL PERMITS, WITHIN THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD

WHEREAS, when a Treatment Works Approval (hereinafter "TWA") Permit Application is associated with a land use application, Township of West Milford engineering review costs are paid from an associated land use escrow account; and

WHEREAS, not all TWA Permit Applications are associated with a land use, and as a result, do not have a land use escrow account and such applications may result in engineering costs to the Township of West Milford; and

WHEREAS, the Township of West Milford desires to require TWA escrow accounts to always satisfy such engineering review costs, including but not limited to include when a TWA permit does not have an associated land use escrow account.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, Passaic County, New Jersey, that the Code of the Township of West Milford shall be amended to create a new section within Article II, Sewer Systems, hereinafter codified at §300-10.1, and to be entitled "Escrow Requirements for Treatment Works Approval Permits" to read as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 300-10.1, Escrow Requirements for Treatment Works Approval Permits

Any application for a Treatment Works Approval Permit not already associated with a land use application shall also be required to create, in an amount approved by the Township Engineer, an escrow account to satisfy any costs of engineering review and approval. The applicant shall remain responsible for any costs in excess of the predetermined escrow account. Any unused escrow monies shall be returned to the applicant upon the approval of the Township Engineer and/or the Township Administrator.

SECTION 2. All ordinances of the Township of West Milford, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, preempted by Federal or State law, or otherwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. No provision of this Ordinance shall be construed to impair any common law or statutory cause of action, or legal remedy there from, of any person for injury or damage arising from any violation of this Ordinance or from other law.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.

 - (6) Used motor oil: \$0.50 per gallon.
- **SECTION 2.** All ordinances of the Township of West Milford, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 1. § 239-2 Funding; utilization of funds.

A. The Open Space, Recreation, and Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund shall be funded through the dedication to the fund of an amount of \$0.02 per \$100 of assessed valuation of each annual tax levy commencing with the year 2022. The fund shall also be permitted to

accept donations and testamentary bequests.

- B. The funds accumulated within the trust fund may be utilized only for the acquisition of lands for recreation and conservation purposes and the payment of debt service on indebtedness issued or incurred by the Township for the purpose of acquisition of lands for recreation and conservation purposes and, for the funds collected beginning January 1, 2014, allocated as follows:
 - (1) At least 33.33% of open space trust funds for the acquisition of properties.
 - (2) Up to 33.33% of open space trust fund monies for the development of or capital improvements to lands acquired for recreation purposes at the discretion of the Township Council.
 - (3) Up to 33.33% of open space trust fund monies for the improvement of lands acquired for conservation or historic preservation purposes at the discretion of the Township Council.
- C. Lands acquired by the Township of West Milford using revenue raised pursuant to this tax authorization shall be held in trust and shall be used exclusively for the purposes authorized under N.J.S.A. 40:12-15.1 et seq. The governing body of the Township of West Milford may change the spending allocation for a given calendar year; however, it must be approved by five

WHEREAS, in 2021 the Township of West Milford adopted an ordinance allowing for the cannabis business licenses within the township, limited to certain zones; and

WHEREAS, the governing body wishes to expand the areas where such businesses might operate in the Township to include all zones with the exception of residential zones.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey as follows that the following code sections only are repealed and replaced as follows:

SECTION 1. Article XVII Cannabis Cultivation, Manufacturing, Wholesale, Distribution, Retail and Delivery

§ 500-192 Cannabis Cultivator, Manufacturer, Wholesaler and Distributor

- A. Cannabis Cultivator, Manufacturer, Wholesaler and Distributors shall be a conditional use in all zones of the Township of West Milford, with the exception that no such conditional use shall occur in any residential zone, and subject to the following:
- (1) Eligible Locations: Facilities shall be at least 500 feet from any parks and 1,000 feet from any schools.
- (2) Lot Area: The minimum lot area shall be one (1) acre.
- (3) Setback: The minimum front yard setback shall be 50 feet or the minimum zone standard, whichever is greater.
- (4) Buildings: All facilities shall be enclosed in heated/air-conditioned buildings, not in greenhouses, hoop houses or outdoors.
- (5) Odor Control: The facility shall provide an air treatment system with sufficient odor absorbing ventilation and exhaust systems such that and odor generated inside the facility is not detectable by a person of reasonable sensitivity at the property line of the subject property. Odor from the facility shall be monitored on an annual basis at the discretion of the Township by a licensed, qualified contractor chosen by the Township. All monitoring costs shall be incurred by the business.
- (6) Signage: Signs shall be limited to the address, name of the company and emergency contact information located on one (1) ground sign not to exceed 24 square feet
- State License: The facility must have a valid license to operate from the State of New Jersey.
 Any cannabis facility is subject to compliance with all laws, regulations and guidelines with respect to cannabis licenses issued by the State of New Jersey and the Township of West Milford.

§ 500-193 Cannabis Retailer

- A. Cannabis retailer shall be a conditional use in all zones of the Township of West Milford, with the exception that no such conditional use shall occur in any residential zone, and subject to the following:
- (1) Eligible Locations: Facilities shall be at least 500 feet from any parks and 1,000 feet from any schools.
- (2) Location: Cannabis retailers shall be separate and distinct from growing operations.
- (3) Buildings: All Cannabis retailers shall be enclosed in heated/air-conditioned permanent buildings, not trailers, outdoors, movable kiosks, etc.
- (4) Signage: Signs shall be limited to location identification/name of business. Signage shall not promote consumption of any cannabis products.
- (5) Site Plan Approval: When seeking site plan approval, the Applicant for Cannabis Delivery services shall submit a safety and security plan and emergency services access plan.
- (6) Accessibility: Any cannabis retailer shall have only one primary public access point, which shall be directly adjacent to the right of way or parking area of the building. Access should not be through common entrances with other uses.
- (7) Hours of operation for cannabis retailers shall be limited to 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
- (8) Interior Security: Cannabis retailers' interiors shall provide a secure location for storage of products, with minimum products in any customer service area.
- (9) Exterior Loitering and Security: People shall not be permitted to congregate outside of a cannabis retailer, loiter or wait in line to access the cannabis retailer. The facility shall have a plan in place if interior capacity is exceeded, i.e. numbers are given and customers wait in their vehicles until called.
- (10) Product Consumption. No products shall be permitted to be consumed on-site.
- (11) State License: The facility must have a valid license to operate from the State of New Jersey.
- (12) Any cannabis facility is subject to compliance with all laws, regulations and guidelines with respect to cannabis licenses issued by the State of New Jersey and the Township of West Milford.

§ 500-194 Cannabis Delivery

- A. Cannabis Delivery shall be a conditional use in all zones of the Township of West Milford, with the exception that no such conditional use shall occur in any residential zone, and subject to the following:
- 1) Eligible Locations: Facilities shall be at least 500 feet from any parks and 1,000 feet from any schools.
- 2) Location: Cannabis Delivery shall be separate and distinct from growing operations.
- 3) Buildings: All Cannabis Delivery services shall be enclosed in heated/air-conditioned permanent buildings, not trailers, outdoors, movable kiosks, etc.
- 4) Signage: Signs shall be limited to location identification/name of business. Signage shall not promote consumption of any cannabis products.
- 5) Site Plan Approval: When seeking site plan approval, the Applicant for Cannabis Delivery services shall submit a safety and security plan and emergency services access plan.
- 6) Interior Security: Cannabis Delivery services interiors shall provide a secure location for storage of products.
- 7) Exterior Loitering and Security: Customers shall not be permitted to pick up products from a Cannabis Delivery service.
- 8) Product Consumption. No products shall be permitted to be consumed on-site.
- 9) State License: The facility must have a valid license to operate from the State of New Jersey.

10) Any cannabis facility is subject to compliance with all State laws, regulations and guidelines with respect to cannabis licenses issued by the State of NJ.

SECTION 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

SECTION 4. The Township Clerk is directed to give notice at least ten (10) days prior to the hearing on the adoption of this Ordinance to the County Planning Board and to all others entitled pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:55D-15. The Township Clerk is further directed to refer this Ordinance to the Township Planning Board, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:55D-64. Upon the adoption of this Ordinance, after public hearing, the Township Clerk is further directed to publish notice of the passage and to file a copy of this Ordinance, as finally adopted, with the Passaic County Planning Board, as required by N.J.S.A. 40:55D-16

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect after publication and passage according to law.

Second reading and public hearing for this Ordinance is set for the Workshop Meeting of the Township Council scheduled for March 2, 2022. Notice of this public hearing shall be published in the Herald News on or about February 8, 2022.

Councilman Chazukow indicated that we were on a bit of a time crunch, in order to pass the ordinance in time for applicants to get their approvals to be able to get their state licenses. There was discussion regarding the minimum lot size, because micro-licenses were going to be issued as well. Councilman Marsden clarified that they would not be allowed in residential areas.

Councilwoman Lichtenberg questioned #5, page one, regarding odor control. The fee should be paid for by the owner, this would apply to the annual inspection. Regarding any nuisance calls, equipment exists to measure particulates. Councilwoman Lichtenberg questioned page two, 500 – 192 and 193, number 10 and number 12 of the previous section should state that they should also comply with West Milford Township, not just the state. Councilwoman Lichtenberg would like it to be put in writing that there will be no gifting of any kind buy two get one free means no taxes on that gifted amount. Mayor Dale said that we are unable to do that because it is not illegal and the state may crack down on it. Councilman Marsden indicated that social media was problematic as well. Councilman Goodsir has concerns with gifting to children. Attorney Sullivan indicated that it is illegal for minors to be in possession.

Councilman Marsden pointed out that the purpose of allowing cannabis was to be able to regulate it, and if it is being gifted it isn't being tested and you have no idea what is in it. Mayor Dale indicated that whenever there is a concern of that nature, especially where minors are concerned, Mr. Senande should be contacted and he can go directly to the Police Chief with that information. Mayor Dale believes it is a temporary issue that will correct itself. Councilman Chazukow agreed and fully expects that once the licenses are issued, the rules will be enforced. He is a consumer advocate and is not in favor of gifting entities.

Councilwoman Lichtenberg would like to see tax funds go to law enforcement and education through the Municipal Alliance fund. There was discussion about the allocation of funds as the state may be putting some of the taxes toward things that may be redundant. Mayor Dale indicated that the general feedback from residents was that they do not want it here but, if it is here than there should at least be the fiscal responsibility of working with the community on drug prevention programs and education. Councilman Chazukow suggested we could put our funds other places than where the state is spending their money. He also has concern about the slowdown of the industry regarding page two, number 10 where it says for retailers that products won't be consumed on the premises.

In conclusion, Mr. Senande indicated that he wanted to hold off on the one acre lot requirement in order to have the planner review that first. Attorney Sullivan indicated that changing that one acre requirement would be substantial. Changes in section 192, item number 5 language will be added stating that the business owner will pay the fee for the annual inspection. In sections 192 number 8 and 193 number 12 language will be changed to add West Milford Township and not just the state regulations and guidelines.
