## ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE CALENDAR YEAR 2025 MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

**WHEREAS**, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of West Milford in the County of Passaic finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2024 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council hereby determines that a 1.00% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$399,034.91 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

**WHEREAS** the Township Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this Governing Body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2025 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of West Milford shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.50%, amounting to \$1,396,622.18, and that the CY 2025 municipal budget for the Township of West Milford be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING PART 1 ADMINISTRATIVE LEGISLATION CHAPTER 10-3 PARKING TO CREATE A NEW SECTION 10-3.10 PROHIBITING CERTAIN OVERNIGHT COMMERCIAL VEHICLE PARKING WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP CODE

WHEREAS, in order to maintain the public's health, safety and welfare, the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of West Milford recognize the need to update Chapter 10-3, to prohibit certain commercial vehicles from parking overnight on all roadways; and

**WHEREAS**, upon the recommendation of the Township of West Milford Police Department, this update is necessary to maintain public safety.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic, and the State of New Jersey that the Township of West Milford Code shall be amended and updated, only as follows to add the following section to be entitled 10-3.10 Overnight Parking of Certain Commercial Vehicles Prohibited.

SECTION 1. 10:3.10 Overnight Parking of Certain Commercial Vehicles Prohibited

#### A. Definitions. As used in this subsection:

LARGE COMMERCIAL VEHICLES shall mean those vehicles weighing more than 3.5 tons with a height of more than 9.5 feet, including installed accessories and/or cargo area/work platform more than 14 feet in length.

MEDIUM COMMERCIAL VEHICLES shall mean those vehicles weighing less than 3.5 tons and less than 9.5 feet in height, including installed accessories and/or cargo area/work platform less than 14 feet in length.

LIGHT COMMERCIAL VEHICLES shall mean those weighing less than 2.5 tons and a cargo area/work platform that is less than the height of the vehicle cab and less than 9 feet in length.

PARK OR PARKING shall mean the standing or waiting on a street, road or highway of a vehicle not actually engaged in receiving or discharging passengers or merchandise, unless in obedience to traffic regulations or traffic signs or signals.

PERSON shall mean natural persons, firms, associations, partnerships and corporations.

PICKUP TRUCK shall mean a truck or other motor vehicle with an open back designed, used or maintained primarily for the regular transportation of property or delivery of services.

STORE shall mean keeping for safe care or custody whether temporarily or permanently.

TRUCK shall mean every motor vehicle designed, used or maintained primarily for the regular transportation of property or delivery of services.

Van shall mean an enclosed motor vehicle designed, used or maintained primarily for the regular transportation of property or delivery of services.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD COUNTY OF PASSAIC AMENDING CHAPTER 152 FIRE PREVENTION SECTION 152-11 ILLEGAL BURNING OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD

WHEREAS, the Township Council wishes to amend the Township Code to the following;

#### **SECTION 1.** Chapter 152 Fire Prevention

§ 152-11. Illegal burning.

A. Definitions. For the purpose of this section, the following definitions shall apply:

#### CHIMINEA, OUTDOOR FIREPLACE or OUTDOOR FIRE PIT

As defined by the manufacturers, approved containers for open burning.

#### **FIREWOOD**

Trunks and branches of trees and bushes, but does not include leaves, needles, vines or brush smaller than three inches in diameter.

#### NUISANCE

Any odor, emission, or event that prevents the reasonable use and enjoyment of one's property.

#### **OPEN BURNING**

An outdoor fire where wood or any combustible materials are burned for recreational purposes. Open burning is allowed at single-family homes, duplexes and townhomes with a permit, provided the regulations set forth herein are met.

#### TREATED LUMBER

Dry wood which has been milled and dried and has been treated or combined with any petroleum product, glue, chemical, preservative, adhesive, stain, paint or other substance.

#### UNTREATED LUMBER

Dry wood which has been milled and dried but which has not been treated or combined with any petroleum product, glue, chemical, preservative, adhesive, stain, paint or other substance.

- B. Open burning regulations.
- Open burning in approved containers shall be allowed with a permit, at single-family homes, duplexes, townhomes, subject to the regulations contained herein.
- (2) Fires shall be limited to a maximum three-foot diameter and two-foot height, and must be contained in a noncombustible chiminea, outdoor fireplace, fire pit or other method, approved by the Fire Prevention Officer.
- (3) All openings in the container or fire pit must be covered with wire mesh or other screening materials that will prevent the passage of sparks or embers.
- (4) Fires must be kept at least 10 feet from any structure or combustible exterior wall.
- (5) Fires must be constantly attended.
- No such fire or container used for open burning may be used on any porch, deck, balcony or any other portion of a building; within any room or space; under any building overhang.
- (7) The burning of yard waste, leaves, brush, vines, evergreen needles, branches smaller than three inches in diameter, treated lumber, garbage, paper products or anything other than seasoned firewood as set forth herein is prohibited.

- (8) All open fires as set forth herein shall be extinguished at the discretion of the Fire Prevention Officer or Police Department.
- (9) The Fire Prevention Officer or police officer may order any open fire, or use of a chiminea, outdoor fireplace or fire pit which creates a nuisance, to be extinguished.
- (10) A permit is required from the New Jersey Forest Fire Service for burning in approved fire pits, and outdoor fireplaces. (Exceptions: Chimineas, gas/propane fire pits, barbecue grills)
- (11) All burning shall be prohibited when the New Jersey State Forest Fire Service issues a burn ban. (Exceptions: gas/propane fire pits and barbecue grills).
- C. Enforcement.
- (1) This section shall be administered by the Division of Fire Prevention and the Police Department.
- (2) Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding the sum of \$1,500, or to imprisonment not exceeding 90 days, or both.
- **SECTION 2.** All ordinances of the Township of West Milford which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **SECTION 3.** If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court or competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this ordinance.
- **SECTION 4.** This Ordinance may be renumbered for purposes of codification.
- **SECTION 5.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD COUNTY OF PASSAIC AMENDING CHAPTER 141 FILMING SECTION 141-3 INSURANCE OF PERMITS, BOND REQUIREMENT, REGULATIONS OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD

WHEREAS, the Township Council wishes to amend the Township Code to the following;

#### SECTION 1. Chapter 141 FILMING

#### § 141-1. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

FILMING — The taking of still or motion pictures either on film or videotape or similar recording medium, for commercial or educational purposes intended for viewing on television, in theaters or for institutional uses. The provisions of this chapter shall not be deemed to include the "filming" of news stories within the Township of West Milford.

PUBLIC LANDS — Any and every public street, highway, sidewalk, square, public park or playground or any other public place within the Township which is within the jurisdiction and control of the Township of West Milford.

#### § 141-2. Permit required; application.

- A. No person or organization shall film or permit filming on public property within the Township of West Milford without first having obtained a permit from the office of the Township Clerk, which permits shall set forth the approved location of such filming and the approved duration of such filming by specific reference to day or dates. Said permit must be readily available for inspection by Township officials at all times at the site of the filming.
- B. All permits shall be applied for and obtained from the office of the Township Clerk during normal business hours. Application for such permits shall be in a form approved by the Township Clerk and be accompanied by a permit fee in the amount established pursuant to this chapter in § 141-4 herein.<sup>1</sup>
- C. One permit shall be sufficient to authorize outdoor or indoor filming for a period not to exceed five days, provided that the maximum number of permits that may be authorized in any calendar year for premises located in a residential zone shall not exceed two without a waiver pursuant to § 141-3 of this chapter.
- D. If a permit is issued, and due to inclement weather or other good cause, filming does not in fact take place on the dates specified, the Township Clerk may, at the request of the applicant, issue a new permit for filming on other dates subject to full compliance with all other provisions of this chapter. No additional fee shall be paid for this permit.

#### § 141-3. Issuance of permits; bond requirement; regulations.

- A. No permits will be issued by the Township Clerk unless applied for prior to 10 days before the requested shooting date; provided, however, that the Township Administrator may waive the ten-day period if, in his judgment, the applicant has obtained all related approvals and adjacent property owners or tenants do not need to be notified.
- B. No permit shall be issued for filming upon public lands unless the applicant shall provide the Township with satisfactory proof of the following:
  - (1) Proof of insurance coverage as follows:
    - \$1,000,000 CSL, General liability covering all operations and products of the film maker.
    - (b) Workers compensation covering all employees of film maker (if any).

- (c) \$1,000,000 CSL Auto liability covering all owned, non-owned and hired autos of said film maker (if any will be used).
- (d) \$1,000,000 CSL Liquor Law Legal liability (if any will be allowed).
- (e) \$1,000,000 CSL liability for unmanned aircraft (drones) (if any will be used).
- The limits above are the minimum, the Township may require higher liability limits and/or other coverages upon review of the application, i.e., nature of activities planned, use of drones or other manned or unmanned aircraft or any other reason it deems necessary.
- (g) Said insurance certificate listed in a, c & e above shall name the Township of West Milford, its officials, agents and employees as additional insured(s) for the use of the property and all operations conducted while filming within the Township of West Milford.
- (2) An agreement, in writing, whereby the applicant agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Township of West Milford from any and all liability, expense, claim or damages resulting from the use of public lands.
- (3) The posting of a cash bond of \$500 or a maintenance bond of \$1,000, running in favor of the Township and protecting and insuring that the location utilized will be left, after filming, in a satisfactory condition, free of debris, rubbish and all equipment, and that due observance of all Township ordinances, laws and regulations will be followed. Upon the completion of the filming, the Township will return the bond if there has been no damage to public property or public expense caused by the filming.
- C. The hiring of an off-duty West Milford police officer for the times indicated on the permit. The holder of the permit shall take all reasonable steps to minimize interference with the free passage of pedestrians and traffic over public lands and shall comply with all lawful directives issued by the West Milford Police Department with respect thereto.
- D. The holder of a permit shall conduct filming in such a manner as to minimize the inconvenience or discomfort to adjoining property owners attributable to such filming and shall, to the extent practicable, abate noise and park vehicles associated with such filming off the public streets. The holder shall avoid any interference with previously scheduled activities upon public lands and limit, to the extent possible, any interference with normal public activity on such public lands. Where the applicant's production activity, by reason of location or otherwise, will directly involve and/or affect any businesses, merchants or residents, these parties shall be given written notice of the filming at least three days prior to the requested shooting date and be informed that objections may be filed with the Township Clerk, said objections to form a part of applicant's application and be considered in the review of the same. Proof of service of notification to adjacent property owners shall be submitted to the Township Clerk within two days of the requested shooting date.
- E. Filming in residential zones shall be permitted Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. or sunset, whichever is earlier, provided that night scenes can be approved in the permit, and hours can be extended if the police officer on the scene determines that there is legitimate delay and the time extension will not greatly inconvenience neighbors.
- The Township Administrator may refuse to issue a permit whenever he determines, on the basis of objective facts and after a review of the application and a report thereon by the Police Department and by other Township agencies involved with the proposed filming site, that filming at the location and/or the time set forth in the application would violate any law or ordinance or would unreasonably interfere with the use and enjoyment of adjoining properties, unreasonably impede the free flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic or otherwise endanger the public's health, safety or welfare. Further, the Township reserves the right to require one or more on-site patrolmen in situations where the proposed production may impede the proper flow of traffic, the cost of said patrolman to be borne by the applicant as a cost of production. Where existing electrical power lines are to be utilized by the production, an on-site licensed electrician may be similarly required if the production company does not have a licensed electrician on staff.
- G. Any person aggrieved by a decision of the Township Administrator denying or revoking a permit or a person requesting relief pursuant to Subsection H may appeal to the Township Council. A

written notice of appeal setting forth the reasons for the appeal shall be filed with the Administrator. An appeal from the decision of the Administrator shall be filed within 10 days of the Administrator's decision. The Township Council shall set the matter down for a hearing within 30 days of the day on which the notice of appeal was filed. The decision of the Township Council shall be in the form of a resolution supporting the decision of the Township Council at the first regularly scheduled public meeting of the Township Council after the hearing on the appeal, unless the appellant agrees in writing to a later date for the decision. If such a resolution is not adopted within the time required, the decision of the Administrator shall be deemed to be reversed, and a permit shall be issued in conformity with the application, or the relief pursuant to Subsection H shall be deemed denied.

- The Township Council may authorize a waiver of any of the requirements or limitations of this chapter, and may authorize filming other than during the hours herein described or may extend the duration of a permit beyond five days or may permit filming at a particular location in a residential zone on more than two occasions during any one calendar year or may waive any other limitation or requirement of this chapter whenever it determines that strict compliance with such limitations will pose an unreasonable burden upon the applicant and that such a permit may be issued without endangering the public's health, safety and welfare.
- Copies of the approved permit will be sent to the Police and Fire Departments before filming takes place and the New Jersey Film Commission. The applicant shall permit the Fire Prevention Bureau or other Township inspectors to inspect the site and the equipment to be used. The applicant shall comply with all safety instructions issued by the Fire Prevention Bureau or other Township inspectors.
- In addition to any other fees or costs mentioned in this chapter, the applicant shall reimburse the Township for any lost revenue, such as parking meter revenue, repairs to public property or other revenues that the Township was prevented from earning because of filming.

The fees for the issuance of permits authorized by this chapter are set forth in Chapter 135, Fees and Costs.

§ 141-5. Violations and penalties.

ORDINANCE TO AMEND AND SUPPLEMENT CHAPTER VIII, DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE, SECTION 15-41 DIVISION OF TAX COLLECTIONS OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic and State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Chapter VIII Department of Finance, Section 15-41, Division of Tax Collections, is hereby amended as follows:

§ 15-41. Division of Tax Collections.

Within the Department of Finance there shall be a Division of Tax Collections. The head of the division shall be the Township Tax Collector. The Municipal Tax Collector shall receive and collect all moneys assessed or raised by taxation or assessment for any purpose. The Collector shall enter in suitable books or other records to be kept by him the sums received each day together with the account to which each receipt is credited. Within 48 hours after the receipt of any moneys of the municipality, or on the first banking day thereafter, the Collector shall deposit such moneys in the authorized public depository of the municipality to the credit of the appropriate account. He shall report to the Council, at least once each month at the same time as the Treasurer is required to report, all receipts and deposits and cash on hand belonging to the municipality. Within 60 days after the end of the fiscal year, and at such other times as may be required by the Council, the Collector shall make and furnish a detailed and true list of all delinquent taxpayers for the next preceding year or for such period as the Council may require. He shall keep a current record of all tax title liens, advising the Treasurer and Administrator promptly as such liens become subject to foreclosure under the law. He shall enforce the payment of delinquent taxes by the means provided by law as soon as same become delinquent. The Tax Collector shall also serve as the Township tax searcher and perform such duties as are prescribed by general law and Township ordinance.

- A. Appointment of Tax Collector. The Tax Collector shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council. Every municipal tax collector shall hold his/her office for a term of 4 years from the first day of January next following his/her appointment. Vacancies other than due to expiration of term shall be filled by appointment for the unexpired term. shall serve for the term of the Mayor and shall receive such compensation as shall be provided by ordinance
- B. Assistant Township Tax Collector. The Mayor with the advice and consent of the Council may appoint an Assistant Township Tax Collector, who shall receive such compensation as shall be provided by ordinance. The duties of the Assistant Township Tax Collector shall be to assist the Tax Collector in the performance of his duties, herein stated, and in accordance with general law and local ordinance, and to act as the Acting Tax Collector during the absence of a Tax Collector.
- B. C. Treasurer and Collector bond. The Treasurer and the Collector shall each give bond, at the expense of the municipality, in accordance with general law.
- **SECTION 2.** All ordinances of the Township of West Milford which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, preempted by Federal or State law, or otherwise invalid by any court or competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining

  - (5) Citizen members No. 3 and No. 4 shall be appointed for one year.
  - (6) Citizen members No. 5 and No. 6 shall be appointed for two years.
  - (7) Citizen members No. 7 and No. 8 shall be appointed for three years.
  - (8) Alternate member No. 1 shall be appointed for a two-year term.
  - (9) Alternate member No. 2 shall be appointed for a one-year term.
- B. Thereafter, citizen members No. 3 through No. 8 shall be appointed for three-year terms, and alternate members No. 1 and No. 2 shall be appointed for two-year terms.

SECTION 2.	All ordinances of the Township of West Milford which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
SECTION 3.	If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court or competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this ordinance.
SECTION 4.	This Ordinance may be renumbered for purposes of codification.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 141 FILMING WITH FILM READY NEW JERSEY REQUIREMENTS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP CODE

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Motion Picture and Television Commission ("NJMPTVC or "the Commission") provides a five step program that educates, trains, and certifies New Jersey municipalities regarding film production "best practices"; and

**WHEREAS**, upon completion of this program, a municipality is awarded a "Film Ready" designation by the Commission, which is helpful in attracting film makers to the Township; and

**WHEREAS**, the Township has completed all of the steps to become a "Film Ready" locality, except for updating its local ordinance to match those terms as proposed by the Commission, and so as to maintain consistency throughout the State; and

**WHEREAS**, encouraging prospective film makers to make films in the Township creates opportunity and revenue, and serves the public's health, safety and welfare.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic, and the State of New Jersey that only the following sections of Township of West Milford Code Chapter 141 Film, shall be amended as follows:

#### SECTION 1. Chapter 141 Filming

#### § 141-2 Permit required; application

B. One permit shall be sufficient to authorize outdoor or indoor filming, provided that the maximum number of permits that may be authorized in any calendar year for premises located in a residential zone shall not exceed two without a waiver pursuant to § 141-3 of this chapter.

#### § 141-3 Issuance of permits; bond requirement; regulations.

- A. No permits will be issued by the Township Clerk unless applied for prior to four (4) days before the requested shooting date; provided, however, that the Film Permit Representative may waive the four (4) day period if, in his judgment, the applicant has obtained all related approvals and adjacent property owners or tenants do not need to be notified.
- **B.** (4) The hiring of an off-duty police officer shall not be required for a permit but may be requested by the permit requestor.
- **E.** Filming in residential zones shall be permitted Monday through Sunday between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m. (camera wrap) and 10:00 p.m. (crew wrap), provided that night scenes can be approved in the permit, and hours can be extended if there is a legitimate delay and that any time extension will not greatly inconvenience neighbors.
- H. The Film Permit Representative, who shall be the Township Business Administrator or his designee, may authorize a waiver of any of the requirements or limitations of this chapter, and may authorize filming other than during the hours herein described or may extend the duration of a permit or may permit filming at a particular location in a residential zone on more than two occasions during any one calendar year or may waive any other limitation or requirement of this chapter whenever it determines that strict compliance with such limitations will pose an unreasonable burden upon the applicant and that such a permit may be issued without endangering the public's health, safety and welfare.

**SECTION 2.** All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Township of West Milford inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

**SECTION 3**. If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court or competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this Ordinance.

**SECTION 4**. This Ordinance may be renumbered for purposes of codification

**SECTION 5**. This Ordinance shall take effect upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 264, ARTICLE II CANVASSERS AND SOLICITORS OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

**BE IT ORDAINED**, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic and State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Article II Canvassers and Solicitors is hereby amended in the following sections as follows:

#### § 263-10. Fees; deposit.

A. The fee for a canvasser's or solicitor's license is set forth in Chapter 135, Fees and Costs, payable to the Township to defray the cost of investigating, fingerprinting if necessary, printing, processing and issuing the permit.

B. In addition, a deposit of \$10 shall be made by applicant with the Township Clerk to assure the return of the badge or certification number as provided for in § 263-13.

#### § 263-11. Registration.

Where, by reason of any federal or state law, any person is deemed to be legally exempt from the provisions of this article or from the requirement of securing a license or permit as herein provided, notwithstanding thereof, such person shall before engaging in any type of soliciting or canvassing, as defined in this article, first register on application forms provided by the Township Clerk with the Chiefof Police, furnishing all of the information as provided for in § 203-2. If the Chief of Police, after proper investigation, shall be satisfied that the registrant is not entitled to the exemption above stated, he shall decline to register him, or after investigation, shall find the registrant's character or business responsibility to be unsatisfactory, he shall decline to register him. If the Chief of Police, after investigation, shall find the registrant's character or business responsibility to be satisfactory, he shall communicate his findings in writing to the Township Clerk's office issuing the license within a reasonable time after the application has been filed issue a certificate of registration. The Application which shall contain the signature of the Chief of Police, and shall show the name and address of the registrant, the name and address of his employer, if any, the kind of goods to be sold by him, or the kind of services to be performed or furnished, the date of issuance and the length of time the registration shall be effective, as well as the license number and other identifying description of any vehicle used in such soliciting or canvassing. The Chief of Police shall keep a permanent record of all registrations. These provisions are to be so applied as not to occasion an undue burden upon interstate commerce, but to be applied for the general protection of the public health, welfare and safety.

#### § 263-12. Hours.

No canvassing or soliciting by anyone holding a permit or license or certification of registration shall be done except Monday through Saturday between the hours of 9:00 a.m. to 30 minutes past sunset. and 5:00 p.m. each weekday.

#### § 263-13. Exhibition of license.

Solicitors and canvassers are required to exhibit their licenses or registrations at the request of any citizen. They shall be required to wear the badge or identification number furnished them on the outer clothing, so that they may be visible at all times while they are canvassing or soliciting. When the permittee shall cease operation under the permit in any event, or on the expiration of the permit, the permittee shall surrender his permit and badge or identification number to the Township Clerk, who in receipt of same shall refund the deposit made for the badge or identification in

#### accordance with § 263-10.

§ 263-14. Loud noises and speaking devices.

No solicitor or canvasser, nor any person in his behalf, shall shout, make any cry out, blow a horn, ring a bell or use any sound device, including any loud-speaking radio or sound-amplifying system upon any of the streets, alleys, parks or other public places of the Township or upon any private premises in the Township where sound of sufficient volume is emitted or produced therefrom to be capable of being plainly heard upon the streets, avenues, alleys, parks or other public places, for the purpose of attracting attention to any goods, wares or merchandise or services which the licensee or registrant proposes to sell.

§ 263-15. Use of streets.

No licensee or registrant shall have any exclusive right to any location in the public streets, nor shall he be permitted a stationary location, nor shall he be permitted to operate in any congested area where his operation might impede or inconvenience the public. He shall not be permitted to stand or remain in any one place for the purpose of soliciting or canvassing of any goods, wares or merchandise, or for any services, for which he has secured a license or registered as per this article, for a period longer than 15 minutes. For the purpose of this section, the judgment of a police officer, exercised in good faith, shall be deemed conclusive as to whether the area is congested or the public impeded or inconvenienced.

§ 263-16. Police enforcement.

A. It shall be the duty of any police officer of the Township of West Milford to require any person seen soliciting or canvassing, and who is not known by such officer to be duly licensed or registered, to produce his solicitor's or canvasser's license or registration certificate, and to enforce the provisions of this article against any person found to be violating the same.

B. The Chief of Police shall report to the Township Clerk all convictions for violations of this article, and the Township Clerk shall maintain a record for each license issued and record the reports of violations therein.

§ 263-17. Exemptions.

- A. The definition of "solicitor" or "canvasser" shall not include persons soliciting or canvassing toward persons within the Township or originating within the Township in behalf of the following, the Township Council reserving to permit by resolution solicitation for any of the following which may originate out of the Township:
  - (1) United Fund.
  - (2) Heart, cancer and similar funds.
  - (3) Red Cross.
  - (4) Nationally chartered veterans' organizations.
  - (5) Sister Kenny.
  - (6) March of Dimes.
  - (7) Churches.
  - (8) Volunteer fire companies.
  - (9) First aid squads.
  - (10) Schools, parent-teachers' associations and other educational activities.
  - (11) Hospitals.
  - (12) Any other charitable organizations or activity not conducted for profit.
- B. In addition, the definition shall not include any person engaged in the delivery of goods, wares or merchandise or other articles or things in the regular course of business, from established local business places, and to persons or premises ordering or entitled to receive same.
- **SECTION 2.** All ordinances of the Township of West Milford which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **SECTION 3.** If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court or competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portion of this ordinance.
