Discussion Items / Official Communications

1.	Ordinance: Park Definition- Mr. Senande indicated that the Cannabis Ordinance did not have a definition, there is a buffer but this item is a draft of a park definition. Councilwoman Lichtenberg suggested that there be a revision stating developed areas larger than one acre that are owned and/or managed by a government entity and used for passive and active recreation. Councilwoman Erik mentioned Pinecliff Lake Beach area which is privately owned. There was a great deal of discussion regarding the definition of a park. A preserve is not a park. Mayor Dale indicated that cannabis businesses could not be placed in residential areas anyway. Councilman Gross had concerns with the language and what would actually be considered a park and pointed out that most of the parks are under an acre. Councilman Chazukow and Councilman Goodsir are fine with it as it is written. Councilman Marsden interpreted it to add more restrictions not less. Eventually a roll call was taken to determine whether or not to move forward. Voted Aye: Chazukow, Goodsir, Marsden Voted Nay: Erik, Lichtenberg, Gross Mayor Dale voted Aye for the tie-break The consensus was to move forward.
2.	Request for Retaining Wall in Municipal ROW- Mr. Senande gave an overview of the situation. It has been a long standing issue and a homeowner has requested that a retaining wall and septic be allowed to remain on a portion of a dead end of a Township road. The Township would have to allow a license. Councilman Chazukow indicated that the home never received a CO and it seems like a case of rewarding unacceptable behavior. Mr. Senande said that if they remove the wall they will also have to remove the septic system. The license will deal with any possible liability issues. The consensus was to move forward.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD COUNTY OF PASSAIC STATE OF NEW JERSEY TO EXCEED THE CALENDAR YEAR 2022 MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.50% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council of the Township of West Milford in the County of Passaic finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2022 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Township Council hereby determines that a 1.00% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$263,034.04 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Township Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

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NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic, a majority of the full authorized membership of this Governing Body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2022 budget year, the final appropriations of the Township of West Milford shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.50%, amounting to \$920,619.14, and that the CY 2022 municipal budget for the Township of West Milford be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF VARIOUS ROADS IN AND BY THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$1,500,000 THEREFOR, DIRECTING A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT OF PART OF THE COST THEREOF, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,428,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING THE SAME

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized as a local improvement to be made or acquired by The Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic, New Jersey. For the said improvement or purpose stated in said Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$1,500,000, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and including the sum of \$72,000 as the down payment for said improvement or purpose required by law and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Township for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose and to meet the part of said \$1,500,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of said down payment, negotiable bonds of the Township are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,428,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvement or purpose, negotiable notes of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$1,428,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. (a) The improvement hereby authorized and purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is the reconstruction and resurfacing of various roads in and by the Township, including Hanover Road for its entire length, Alpine Court for its entire length, Beverly Court for its entire length, Princeton Road, for a portion thereof and Lyons Road for a portion thereof, so as to provide a roadway pavement at least equal in useful life or durability to a roadway pavement of Class B construction (as such term is used or referred to in section 40A:2-22 of said Local Bond Law) and being those lands designated on the official tax map of the Township as Lots 1, 3 and 4 in Block 901, Lots 1 and 22 in Block 905, Lot 1 in Block 906, Lots 7 to 9 and 11 to 16 in Block 1001, Lots 1, 3, 9, 11 and 12 in Block 1002, Lots 1 to 4 in Block 1003, Lots 1 to 3, 5, 8 to 11, 12.01, 12.02, 12.03 and 13 to 17 in Block 1004, Lots 1, 2, 5, 6, 8, 9 and 14 to 17 in Block 1005, and Lots 7 to 9 in Block 1006, including all storm

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water drainage facilities, milling, inlets, curbing, structures, appurtenances, equipment, site work, work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Township Clerk and hereby approved.

- (b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$1.428.000.
- (c) The estimated cost of said purpose is \$1,500,000, the excess thereof over the said estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor being the amount of the said \$72,000 down payment for said purpose.

SECTION 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

 $(a) \qquad \text{The said purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Township may lawfully acquire or make as a local improvement.}$

(b) The period of usefulness of said purpose within the limitations of said Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is ten (10) years.

(c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$1,428,000, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$200,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations and other items of expense listed in and permitted under section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the cost of said improvement and is included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

(e) As provided in Section 5 of this bond ordinance and subject to possible reduction as described in Section 5 of this bond ordinance, \$1,136,500 of the above-stated estimated cost of said improvement or purpose will be contributed by the Township at large to payment of the cost of said improvement or purpose, and the estimated maximum amount of the special assessments to be levied on property specially benefitted by said improvement is \$363,500, and the number of annual installments in which all such special assessments may be paid is ten (10).

SECTION 5. The Township shall pay \$1,136,500 of the above-stated estimated cost of said local improvement (provided, however, that if the actual cost of said local improvement is less than the above-stated estimated cost of said local improvement, the Township's portion of the cost of said local improvement shall be reduced by the amount of said difference), and said amount shall be and hereby is contributed by the Township at large to payment of the cost of said local improvement. The cost of said local improvement, to the extent not met by the said amount contributed by the Township at large, shall be paid by special assessments which shall be levied in accordance with law on property specially benefitted thereby, as nearly as may be in proportion to and not in excess of the peculiar benefit, advantage or increase in value which the respective lots and parcels of real estate shall be deemed to receive by reason of said local improvement. The owner of any land upon which any such assessment shall have been made may pay such assessment in the number of equal annual installments hereinabove determined, all as may be provided in accordance with law and with legal interest on the unpaid balance of the assessment.

SECTION 6. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer, acting chief financial officer or treasurer of the Township (the "Chief Financial Officer"), provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale at not less than par and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Township at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 7. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

SECTION 8. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or

temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Township Clerk and are available for public inspection.

SECTION 9. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$5,432,000 AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,857,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP, FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC, NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, IN THE COUNTY OF PASSAIC, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by The Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic, New Jersey. For the said several improvements or purposes stated in said Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for said improvements or purposes, said sums being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and amounting in the aggregate to \$5,432,000 including the aggregate sum of \$243,000 as the several down payments for said improvements or purposes required by law and more particularly described in said Section 3 and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Township for down payment or for capital improvement purposes and including also in the case of the improvement or purpose described in paragraph (a) of said Section 3, the sum of \$332,000 received or expected to be received by the Township from the New Jersey Department of Transportation as a grant-in-aid of financing said improvement or purpose.

SECTION 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes and to meet the part of said \$5,432,000 appropriations not provided for by application hereunder of said down payments and grant, negotiable bonds of the Township are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$4,857,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$4,857,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

SECTION 3. The improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, the appropriation made for and estimated cost of each such purpose, and the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each such purpose, are respectively as follows:

Except as otherwise stated in paragraph (a) above with respect to the said grant-in-aid of financing the purpose described in said paragraph, the excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the said down payment for said purpose.

SECTION 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The said purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and each is a property or improvement which the Township may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of said Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the respective amounts of the said obligations authorized for the several purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 10.57 years.
- (c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$4,857,000, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- (d) Amounts not exceeding \$275,000 in the aggregate for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the costs of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimate thereof (and, in particular, such costs have been included in the improvement described in Section 3(c) of this bond ordinance).

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SECTION 5. The funds from time to time received by the Township on account of the \$332,000 grant referred to in Section 1 of this bond ordinance shall be used for financing the improvement or purpose described in paragraph (a) of Section 3 of this bond ordinance by application thereof either to direct payment of the costs of said improvements or purposes, or to payment or reduction of the authorization of the obligations of the Township authorized therefor by this bond ordinance. Any such funds so received may and all such funds so received which are not required for direct payment of the costs of said improvements or purposes shall, be held and applied by the Township as funds applicable only to the payment of obligations of the Township authorized by this bond ordinance.

SECTION 6. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer, acting chief financial officer or treasurer (the "Chief Financial Officer"), provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes at no less than par from time to time at public or private sale at not less than par and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Township at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

SECTION 7. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

SECTION 8. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Township Clerk and are available for public inspection.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. Section 26:3-1, Establishment of local board, directs that there shall be a board of health in every municipality in this state, which board shall consist of members appointed or designated, or both, as provided by this chapter, except that in any municipality operating under laws establishing a form of government for such municipality under which the full powers of a local board of health cannot be exercised by a local board of health so appointed or designated, the respective functions of a local board of health shall be exercised by such boards, bodies, or officers as may exercise the same according to law; and

WHEREAS, the Township Code currently authorizes, at Section 15-89(b), for the Township of West Milford Advisory Board of Health to hear appeals of decisions made by the Township Health Officer, but pursuant to N.J.S.A. Section 26:3-1, such appeals should instead be heard by the Board of Health, as exercised by Township Council, as the full powers of a local board of health cannot be exercised by a local board of health so appointed or designated; and

WHEREAS, Per N.J.S.A. 26:3-1 et seq., the Health Advisory Board will continue to provide policy and action recommendations, and act to support the Township Council in its capacity as the Board of Health, and serve as public health advocates to the community.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, Passaic County, New Jersey, that the Code of the Township of West Milford shall be repealed and replaced and as to Section 15-89 only, to read as follows:

SECTION 1. § 15-89 Powers and duties; appeals

- A. The Advisory Board of Health shall advise the Mayor and Council concerning matters of public health within the Township. It shall make recommendations to the Mayor and Council concerning or relating to the operation and administration of the Department of Health to the Township Council concerning or touching upon matters of policy or ordinances affecting the public health.
- B. The Board of Health, and its respective functions as exercised by Township Council pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:3-1 et seq, shall have the power to hear and decide appeals of all variance decisions rendered by the Township Health Officer. Notice of an appeal of a decision of the Health Officer shall be filed with the Township Administrator within 15 days of receipt of the Health Officer's decision. The Board of Health, and in its respective function as exercised by Township Council, shall conduct a hearing, at which the applicant for the variance shall have the right to appear and be heard, to cross examine opposing witnesses and to present witnesses in his own behalf. The Board of Health, and in its respective function as exercised by Township Council, shall conduct the hearing and render a decision within 30 days of receipt of the notice of appeal.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body wishes to update the ordinance to better define how to measure such distances, so as to minimize confusion and allow prospective cannabis businesses to make informed decisions as to locations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey as follows that the following code sections shall be added to Chapter 500 Entitled Zoning, creating a new Section § 500-205, to be entitled "Measurement and Buffering", as follows:

SECTION 1. § 500-205 Measurement and Buffering

- A. There shall be a minimum distance of not less than 2,500 feet between licensed cannabis retail businesses.
- B. Such measurement shall be obtained by measuring the nearest entrance of one location which is licensed, to the nearest entrance of the second location which seeks to be licensed.
- C. Such measurement shall be measured on how a pedestrian would normally walk, and not in a straight line "as the crow flies."
- D. As to distance prohibitions from parks and or schools and as reflected in this chapter, such distances shall be measured in the normal way that a pedestrian would normally walk from the nearest entrance, to such a park or school and not in a straight line "as the crow flies."

SECTION 2. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed as to such inconsistencies.

Ms. Mageean proceeded to do a power point presentation showing specifics of the Budget. She summarized the expenditures. Grant money was much higher last year due to Covid-19. Debt service is down significantly because we payed off our 2010 bonds last year. The total budget is \$35,027,400.00. The 2022 Tax Rate including library, open space and garbage is \$1.00. Municipal Tax Increase is \$77.07 on an average home assessed at \$242,000 for 2022. \$1,378,013 of the first Tranche of the American Rescue Plan Money has been used. The second Tranche for the same amount will be received this year and can be utilized through 2024. LOSAP and aid was increased for the Fire Companies and First Aid Squads.

The top 5 expenses are Public Safety, Public Works, Statutory Expenses, Debt Service and Reserve for Uncollected Taxes. The Fund Balance is the highest it has ever been and that is a good thing. We were not spending as much money during the shutdown. The Tax Levy CAP is under by almost a million dollars. The cost of Solid Waste removal continues to rise and as those costs go up the taxpayers bear the burden. The State does not allow us to reduce out Tax Levy. Mayor Dale explained that every time you take money from the surplus you create the deficit in the budget the following year and it is not prudent to create a dent in the surplus.
