Proclamations

Extra Mile 2022 – Mayor Dale read the proclamation and encouraged all residents to maximize their personal contributions. Extra Mile Day is November 1, 2022.

Knock Out Opioid Abuse Day – Councilwoman Lichtenberg read the proclamation declaring October 6th Knock Out Opioid Abuse Day. Debbie O'Brien, the Municipal Alliance Coordinator, gave some statics on drug overdose deaths. There was an increase of about 15% from 2020 to 2021. Since 1999 more than 932,000 people in the United States have died from a drug overdose. We have a serious problem in this country. This silent pandemic has very likely affected every single person in some way. The Municipal Alliance is a concerned group that collaborates with other organizations as well as promotes various awareness programs, "We're Not Buying It", "Hidden in Plain Sight" as well as others and has been involved in the Scott's Fun Run/Stigma Free Run. Melissa Brown Blaeuer – Is a Democratic Party hopeful and will be running for Town Council this fall and has run for Council and State Assembly in the past. She has been volunteering in town for many years, knows the current members of the Council and believes in building trust and unity. Mrs. Brown Blaeuer gave an overview of her platform and is in favor of bipartisanship and liberty and justice for all not just some. Ms. Brown Blaeuer is also an advocate for environmental protection. People can follow the group on social media, they are listed as the West Milford Democrats and they will have a booth at the ALF celebration this weekend.

Troy Oswald, 20 Dogwood Lane – Has lived and worked in the Township since the 1990's and has seen change for the better in that time period. He congratulated the Mayor and Council for doing a great job. Mr. Oswald is a former Police Chief for the city of Paterson, and when he was acting Chief they had the biggest drop in crime in 32 years and a 60% reduction in homicides. Mr. Oswald worked with the FBI to root out corruption on the force which culminated in the arrests of 8 police officers known as the robbery gang. He has been asked by the Republican Party to run as County Commissioner. He is trying to bring some change to Passaic County as we pay the highest taxes of any County. He would like to see an increase in County services as well as a reduction in taxes.

Rich McCloskey, Leonard Ave – Is a Deputy Fire Chief with Company #4 and has worked with others to improve the water supply training drills to help the ISO rating improve. The Mayor and Council were invited to attend the next drill scheduled to take place at High Crest Lake, near the lodge area on Sunday, October 9th at 10 a.m. The drills will be conducted with the equipment currently available and the Mayor and Council should see the training drill in action. Mutual Aid companies will be providing coverage for the Township during that time and the drill should conclude by noon.

Discussion Items / Official Communications

	Ordinance – Macopin Road Speed Limit – Councilman Marsden made the point that distracted driving and not speeding was the largest contributor to the number of accidents and it may be an enforcement issue. Mayor Dale voiced concern regarding the area near Arundel Road and the fact that Macopin Road has areas that ebb and flow. Councilwoman Erik indicated that the speed limit would need to be changed and then enforced for people to learn. Councilman Goodsir is only in
1.	favor of a speed decrease from Fredrick to Bubbling Springs. Councilwoman Lichtenberg wanted the Zone 3 portion to extend to include Arundel. Councilman Chazukow found the data to be very interesting and helpful and noted that the time of day for most accidents was during the morning and evening rush hours. Councilman Gross questioned if we had a police car available to park and deter speeders. There was more discussion. Councilman Marsden wants to drive it again. The consensus was to put it back on the agenda for further discussion.
2.	Ordinance – Outdoor Wood Burning Furnaces – Administrator Senande indicated that there was no current code covering these furnaces. They burn wood so they are a fire hazard and also they create smoke. The location needs to be designated, how close to a home and a neighbor's home. The current parameters are based on the Planner's recommendations. There was discussion regarding furnaces and lot sizes. If no ordinance exists then there is no permitted use. There is an application pending in the Building Department and since they are not currently permitted, this issue has come to light. Councilman Marsden would like to see the specifications and criteria for these types of furnaces. Administrator Senande indicated that the distance that has been considered is so that the furnace is far enough away from the neighbors. Councilman Chazukow is in favor of people being able to use cleaner running, sustainable home heating sources. There was more discussion about specifications from the manufacturer and setback distances. Mayor Dale asked the Council what the distance from a neighboring property line should be. Councilwoman Erik pointed out that every zone has different setback distances. Township Attorney Pasternak

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indicated that the distances that were set forth by the Planner were based on the smoke that would be emitted. You don't want to be blowing smoke into your neighbor's back yard or onto their deck. We would want to take zoning into consideration and not just pick a random number, even though we would want to make the distance as minimal as possible. Attorney Pasternak suggested that we could send it back to the Township Planner for review. That input would be very valuable.

The consensus was to have this revisited by the Planner to make sure the setback distances would best apply to West Milford.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 500 "ZONING" OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES TO UPDATE SECTION 500-192 "CANNABIS CULTIVATOR, MANUFACTURER, WHOLESALER AND DISTRIBUTOR"

WHEREAS in 2021 the Township of West Milford adopted an ordinance allowing for cannabis business licenses within the township and setting forth distances between any cannabis business and parks, schools and other cannabis businesses; and

WHEREAS the Governing Body wishes to update the ordinance to minimize confusion and better define cannabis on lots of 10 acres or more.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey as follows that the following "Cannabis cultivator, manufacturer, wholesales and distributor" section be amended to add the following"

SECTION 1. § 500-192 Cannabis cultivator, manufacturer, wholesaler and distributor.

- Cannabis cultivators, manufacturers, wholesalers, and distributors shall be permitted uses on lots Β. of 10 acres or more in any zone district and shall adhere to the following special design standards:
 - Eligible locations: Parcels which are 10 acres or more in all zone districts. (1) (2)
 - Greenhouse cultivation: Greenhouse cannabis cultivation may occur in a greenhouse with rigid walls, a partial greenhouse or a hoop house or other non-rigid structure. The following requirements must be met:
 - The operator of the greenhouse cultivation must be a licensed Class 1 Cultivator or Class 2 Manufacturer.
 - In no case shall a cannabis facility operate or be located on land that is valued, ii. assessed, or taxed as an agricultural or horticultural use pursuant to the Farmland Assessment Act of 1964, P.L. 1964, c. 48 (N.J.S.A. 54:423.1 et seq.). Properties that are farmland assessed prior to use for cannabis facilities shall have the farmland assessment removed prior to commencement of operations.
 - iii. The outdoor growing area shall be situated to maintain the greatest achievable level of privacy and security.
 - iv. The outdoor growing area of the property must be securely surrounded by fencing and locked gates on the entire perimeter, constructed in accordance with the Uniform Construction Code and the Township Zoning Code, to prevent access to the grow area by unauthorized persons.
 - Locks on gates shall be commercial-grade, non-residential door locks. v
 - vi. The outdoor growing area shall be protected by a security system and 24-hour video surveillance system that is continuously monitored and capable of detecting power loss, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 17:30-9.10, to ensure surveillance of the entire perimeter of the growing area and overall portions of the security fences and all gates.
 - (3) Setbacks: All principal structures and any associated cannabis facilities, including greenhouses as described in §500-192B(2), must be set back at least 100 feet from any property line.
 - Odor control: The facility shall provide an air treatment system with sufficient odor (4) absorbing ventilation and exhaust systems, such that any odor generated by the cannabis cultivation is not detectable by a person of reasonable sensitivity at the property line of the subject property. Greenhouses may use a combination of setbacks and ventilation to mitigate odor. Odor from the facility maybe monitored on an annual basis at the discretion of the Township by a licensed, qualified contractor chosen by the Township, and at the expense of the cannabis licensee.

Councilwoman Erik sought clarification for the term farm assessed. Administrator Senande indicated that there was a cut out for the cannabis, not for the entire lot. It refers to the land not the full lot and the land cannot be farm assessed. Councilwoman Erik also questioned the fencing height. The State is requiring an 8' fence and the Town only allows for a 6' fence. Attorney Pasternak indicated that there were to be two distinguishable fences, one around the growing area and one for the perimeter of the property. Administrator Senande clarified that because we adopted the zoning ordinance permitting the business under the State regulations, someone building an 8' fence for cannabis would not have to go before the Board of Adjustment for a variance. Councilman Marsden indicated that there will need to be a number of security measures met as well.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 285 PROPERTY MAINTENANCE SECTION 285-13 SHORT TERM RENTALS OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP

BE IT ORDAINED by the Municipal Council of the Township of West Milford, County of Passaic, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 285-13 Short-term rentals shall be amended as follows:

- F. Application process for short-term rental permit and inspections.
- (h) A certification from the Township Fire Prevention Office that the premises have the required smoke and CO (Carbon Monoxide) alarms and fire extinguishers and that all are in working order.

SECTION 2. All ordinances of the Township of West Milford, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 3. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, preempted by Federal or State law, or otherwise invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4. No provision of this Ordinance shall be construed to impair any common law or statutory cause of action, or legal remedy there from, of any person for injury or damage arising from any violation of this Ordinance or from other law.

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SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY CONCERNING SALARIES AND COMPENSATION FOR ADMINISTRATIVE, CONFIDENTIAL AND UNAFFILIATED EMPLOYEES

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic, New Jersey that pursuant to Chapter 33 entitled Personnel of the Revised General Ordinances of the Township of West Milford, New Jersey, 1976, the following Officer(s) and Employee(s) here below stated shall be classified by job title with the corresponding pay ranges:

1. The aforelisted Officer(s) and Employee(s) shall be compensated in accordance with the preceding Salary Range.

- BENEFITS: Benefits relating to vacation, sick days, personal days, longevity, holidays, bereavement leave and medical insurance shall be those as contained in the contract between the West Milford Municipal Employees Guild (AFSCME 3301) and the Township of West Milford or any employment agreement consistent with applicable law.
- 3. OVERTIME: If not otherwise eligible for overtime compensation by contract or law, each full-time department and division head in lieu of overtime compensation as provided in the Guild contract, shall receive three (3) vacation days and up to 35 compensatory hours annually, the latter earned hour for hour for hours worked above forty per week. All other full-time employees listed in this ordinance if not otherwise eligible for overtime compensation by contract or law, shall receive 21 compensatory hours annually, plus one half hour for each hour worked above thirty-five or forty hours per week depending on the applicable contract for the employee's department. Vacation and compensatory time may be used or accumulated as follows: vacation days may be carried for up to one year from January 1 following the year earned, and compensatory hours may be taken no later than April 1 of the year following the year earned.
- 4. Stipend Positions will not be subject to increases unless specifically authorized by Resolution of the Governing Body.
- 5. Any ordinance or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to such extent as they are in conflict or inconsistent. This ordinance shall take effect 20 days after its final passage by the Township Council.

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING SECTION 500-92 EMERGENCY STANDBY GENERATORS PARAGRAPH (C) SITING AND PLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL GENERATORS OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE TOWNSHIP

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council previously clarified the ordinance and amended Section 500-92 Emergency Standby Generators; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Township Council wish to further clarify the ordinance provisions for emergency standby generators on residential and commercial lots with the amended kW size shown below; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Township Council of the Township of West Milford, in the County of Passaic, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 500 "Zoning" Section 500-92 Emergency Standby Generators is amended to read as follows:

§ 500-92. Emergency standby generators.

- C. Siting and placement requirements for all generators.
 - (1) Emergency standby generators shall be considered minor accessory structures (if less than 25 kW in size if 25 kW or less) and must adhere to the requirements for minor accessory structures as set forth in § 500-92.1C. If the generator is larger than 25 kW, standard accessory structure standards apply.
- **SECTION 2.** All ordinances of the Township of West Milford, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- **SECTION 3.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reasons held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
- **SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval and publication as required by law.
- **SECTION 5.** This Ordinance may be renumbered for codification purposes.

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF WEST MILFORD, COUNTY OF PASSAIC, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN AGREEMENT WITH THE NORTH JERSEY MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEE BENEFITS FUND TO RENEW MEMBERSHIP

WHEREAS, a number of public entities in the State of New Jersey have joined together to form the North Jersey Municipal Employee Benefits Fund, hereafter referred to as "FUND", as permitted by N.J.S.A. 11:15-3, 17:1-8.1, and 40A:10-36 et seq., and;

WHEREAS, the FUND was approved to become operational by the Departments of Insurance and Community Affairs and has been operational since that date, and;

WHEREAS, the statutes and regulations governing the creation and operation of a joint insurance fund, contain certain elaborate restrictions and safeguards concerning the safe and efficient administration of the public interest entrusted to such a FUND;

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Township of West Milford, hereinafter referred to as "LOCAL UNIT" has determined that membership in the FUND is in the best interest of the LOCAL UNIT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Body of the Township of West Milford hereby agrees as follows:

- 1) Become a member of the FUND for the period outlined in the LOCAL UNIT's Indemnity and Trust Agreement.
- 2) Will participate in the following type (s) of coverage (s):
- Health Insurance and/or dental and/or prescription as defined pursuant to N.J.S.A. 17B:17-4, the FUND's Bylaws, and Plan of Risk Management.
- 3) Adopts and approves the FUND's Bylaws.
- 4) Execute an application for membership and any accompanying certifications.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Township Clerk of the Township of West Milford be and are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Indemnity and Trust Agreement and such other documents signifying membership in the FUND as required by the FUND's Bylaws, and to deliver these documents to the FUND's Executive Director with the express reservation that these documents shall become effective only upon:

- 1) Approval of the LOCAL UNIT by the FUND.
- 2) Receipt from the LOCAL UNIT of a Resolution accepting assessment.
- 3) Approval by the New Jersey Department of Insurance and Department of Community Affairs.


